DA Dismisses Forgery Count

Forgery charges against a 19-year-old Grants Pass girl, Betty Janeva Retchless, were dismissed Thursday by the district attorney's office. Deputy District Attorney Robert M. Redding said Mrs. Retchless was already on probation in three counties in Oregon and California on charges involving the same string of checks. Mrs. Retchless admitted cashing forged checks last November in Klamath Falls, Eugene, Redding and Crescent City. She pleaded guilty in each case. Redding said Mrs. Retchless agreed to make restitution for her worthless checks and this agreement was made a part of her probation order in Lane County. She had no prior record.

Thief Raids Local School

A thief who knew what he was doing entered Conger School Wednesday night and stole an undetermined amount of small change and stamps. James Young, school principal, reported the burglary to city police Thursday.
