Garden Club Plans Sale

The ideal time for transplanting trees, shrubs and perennials in the Klamath country is during the months of March and April. The current spring season has been most accommodating with its frequent showers and skills of snow, leaving the soil friable and easily worked.

As a timely reminder to gardeners, and to assist them in taking advantage of this moisture content of the soil, the Klamath Falls Garden Club is sponsoring a sale of plants and trees March 17 and 18 at the corner of Sixth Street and Klamath Avenue, from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day.

The T. B. Watters garden on Pacific Terrace, one of the outstanding gardens of Southern Oregon, will contribute choice plants for this occasion as well as other local gardens.

A few of the items for sale include a variety of perennials, succulents, cacti, Italian prune trees, free-stone plum trees and dish gardens.

The sale will benefit the club's Moore Park project, which has been undertaken by the garden club in cooperation with the City Park and Recreation Department, and which consists of approx-

imately an acre of ground bordering the grass area of the extension division.

The area will be landscaped with predominately native trees, shrubs, ground covers, and native plants to afford protection, nesting places and food for the birds of the area.

In addition to the esthetic value of the project, it will serve as an educational factor in that all plant specimens will be labeled.

Much of the maintenance will be assumed by the City Park and Recreation Department, since Moore Park, though classed as a regional park, lies wholly within the confines of the city of Klamath Falls. However, additional funds are needed by the club for the purchase of plant materials, for repairs, for seats and supplies.

By way of a seasonal suggestion, a dish garden makes an appropriate Easter gift, while a hospital patient will surely appreciate a small dish garden for his or her bedside table.

A pre-nuptial shower honored the bride-elect in January. Mrs. Gordon Wynant was hostess for the affair.

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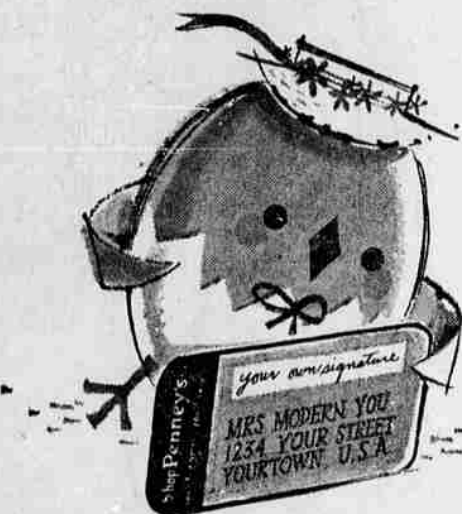
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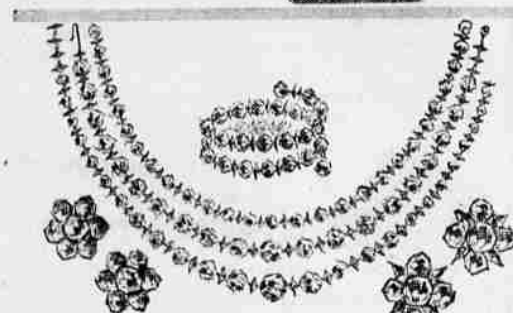
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
