Henley Hornets, Rooters Take First Tourney Trip

If the string of firsts that the Henley Hornets basketball team has going for it on the trip to Coos Bay today holds up, it might well return home with the Oregon A-2 basketball championship.

The Hornet cagers, the championship team in the Rogue League, left early this morning for Coos Bay where they will represent District 6A-2 in the annual basketball classic which will begin Monday afternoon on the Marshfield High floor.

Either leaving at the same time as their team, or planning departures later today and early tomorrow, are a horde of avid Henley rooters intent upon seeing their favorites handle the vaunted Madras White Buffaloes in the tournament opener at 2 p.m. Monday.

The eight-team single elimination tournament will continue through Tuesday and culminate with the championship game at 8:45 Wednesday night. (See tournament bracket.)

The Coos Bay jaunt marks the first time that Henley, as an A-2 school, has entered a state basketball tourney. It also provides them a chance at their first state championship in any sport since their stepping out of the B class.

For Henley coach Jerry Johnson, the tournament is the climax of his first year as the head coach at any school. Also, his Henley job is his first teaching assignment since graduation from Klamath Union High School and the University of Oregon.

In 1960 Johnson joined the Henley staff as the assistant to head coach Fred Hess. Upon Hess' resignation Johnson moved into the command of the varsity Hornet cagers.

During the year the Henley five compiled a 19-3 win-loss record for the season, two of the victories coming in the four-team district playoffs recently at Ashland where they played Glide and Lakeview for the right to go to state. During Rogue League conference action they picked up their championship by virtue of a 9-1 record, their lone defeat coming at the hands of Lakeview, midway through the schedule.

Prior to this try the only state titles notched at Henley, either as an A-2 or a B school, came in 1946, 1948 and 1949. In '48-'49 they annexed the state track crown and in 1946 they collected the state B football championship. In '47-'48 they also finished as runners-up in football.

The Hornet squad includes Bert Allbritton, Kent Gooding, Ray Brown, Bob Chapman, Floyd Kendall, Mike Taechini, Chuck Blofsky, Larry Blofsky, Tom Wolfe and Danny Barrett.

The tourney entries, other than Henley and Madras, include Sherwood, Mount Angel, Seaside, Pleasant Hill, Coquille and Reedsport.

Kono Hoists Record High

MOSCOW (AP)—Tommy Kono, U.S. Olympic weightlifter from Honolulu and Los Angeles, set a world record 337½ pounds (153 kilograms) in the press phase of the middleweight competition at the Prize of Moscow tournament Saturday.

Kono's effort bettered the listed record of Russia's Anatoly Zhitetskiy by .441 pounds (2 kilograms).

California Governor Favors Creation Of Strong National Boxing Commission

WASHINGTON (UPI)—California Gov. Edmund G. Brown has charged that criminals have infiltrated boxing "to a marked degree" and the states are helpless to oust them.

Brown urged creation of a national boxing commission with power to license fighters, promoters, matchmakers and managers who participate in interstate bouts.

He said "in no other industry would we tolerate" the situation which he said is present in boxing. Federal help is needed, he said, because of the interstate nature of the sport.

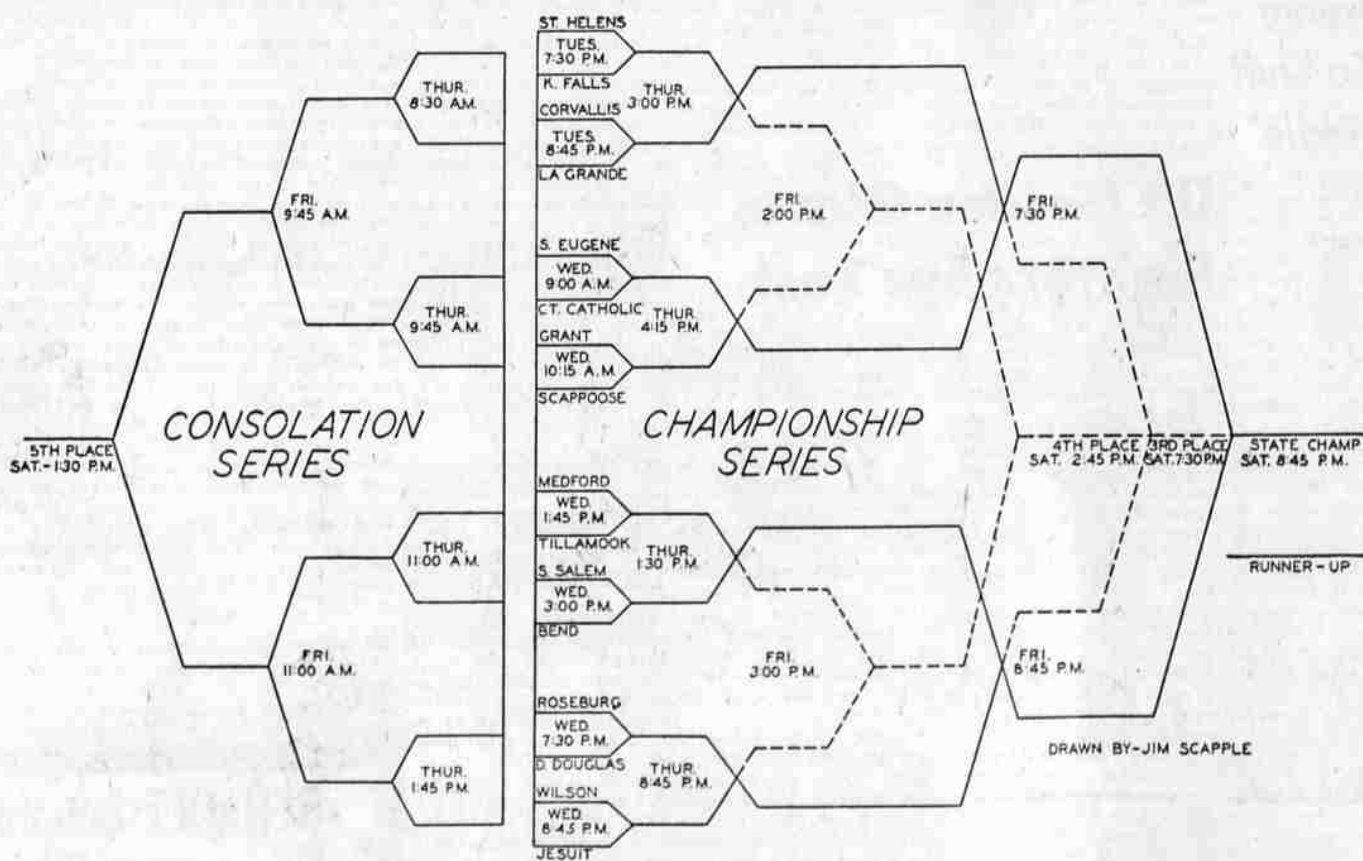
