Refinishing Worn Floor Hard Task

Refinishing a hardwood floor is one do-it-yourself project for which there are no short cuts. If you expect the best results, three important rules must be followed strictly:

1. The floor must be clean. Use alkaline cleaners, solvents or hot water to remove all dirt, oil, grease, wax and the like.

2. The floor must be properly primed. One coat never is enough for unfinished surfaces (which includes old surfaces sanded down to the bare wood). The primer must be a proper kind, correctly thinned.

3. Use only materials recommended for floor finishing, and thin them and apply them exactly as recommended on the label.

A badly worn floor should be sanded down to the bare wood. Use a power sander with the grain to do the job smoothly and easily. If the old varnished floor is in fair condition it may require no preparation other than thorough cleaning.

After thoroughly dusting a well-sanded floor, open grain woods (particularly oak) must then be filled with a wood filler.

Reduce the paste wood filler to a point consistency and apply lengthwise with the grain using a three or four inch brush. Don't try to cover more than a strip about two feet wide at a time.

A whitish cast will begin to appear at the starting point, indicating the filler is drying properly. When this happens begin to wipe off the excess filler.

Rub it off across the grain with burlap or excelsior, leaving the filler only in the pores of the wood. Sweep off the excess filler particles and allow the floor to dry overnight.

Next apply a primer coat of good grade varnish thinned as recommended by the manufacturer. Let it stand overnight, sand it, and dust it well. Then apply one or two top coats of unthinned floor varnish. Allow the first coat to stand 24 hours, then sand it and apply the second coat.

If you plan to paint the floor, new wood needs only to be clean, smooth and dry. Prime it and finish it according to the label on the can of paint you intend to use.

Previously painted floors in good condition need only to be cleaned. But if the surface is in poor condition or thick with previous coats of paint it should be removed down to the bare wood and finished as though it were new wood.

New concrete floors should be roughened by etching for better adhesion of the paint. You can use a solution of one part full strength muriatic acid to three parts water, or you can use Saniflush, Bowlene or similar products sprinkled on a dampened floor.

After about 20 minutes, rinse the floor thoroughly and allow it to dry.

Previously painted concrete floors usually require no etching, but should be spot primed and painted according to the manufacturer's directions.
