Teen-Age Behavior Extension Units Topic

"Understanding Teen-Age Behavior" is being discussed in extension unit meetings during March, reports Mrs. Ruth G. Dyer, county extension agent. Leaders were trained for this lesson in January by Mrs. Roberta Frasier, family life specialist, Oregon State College.

Homemakers are learning that behavior is complex and puzzling. They are learning that present behavior is determined by characteristics at birth, the experiences, the way these experiences appear, concept of self, and the satisfactions of basic needs.

Homemakers are also learning that each stage of development is built upon preceding stages and at each stage, specific tasks must be accomplished. The goal of each individual is to develop from dependence to independence to interdependence.

One of the basic tips in guiding a teenager, Mrs. Frasier says, is to accept individual differences. Listen to learn—learn to listen to the teenager. Use praise to reinforce behavior and use a positive approach when guiding him.
