Adolph Eichmann was two men—the tormentor and the tormented.

Meanwhile, the father's electrical business had failed and young Eichmann was forced to make his way in an inflation-ridden Austria, easy prey to Hitler's expansionist promises.

Contrast this with a scene near Minsk, in Nazi-occupied Russia, in the winter of 1941. Eichmann, 10 years older and no longer carefree, wears the black uniform of a Schutzstaffeln (SS) major with a long leather coat. On his peaked cap is the silver death's head insignia of the SS.
