Crash Kills 2 Officers

RED BLUFF (UPI)—Two officers at the Air Force facility here were killed Monday when their low-flying private plane stalled and crashed near the base.

The victims were Capt. Kenneth Leonard Frank, 42, Yreka, and Lt. William Watson Thomas, 23, Brunswick, Ga.

Observers at the Air Force aircraft control and warning base said the plane, owned by a club at the base, was maneuvering close to the ground when it went into a stall and the pilot was unable to gain control.

The plane, a T34 trainer purchased by the club, was demolished.
