

Fish, Game Commission Backs Salmon Bill

SALEM (AP) — A proposed \$1 by the state Fish and Game commission to rebuild Oregon's salmon resources was strongly supported Monday night.

SERVICES FOR ACTRESS

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Funeral services were held Monday for British actress Belinda Lee, 23, killed last week in an auto crash. About 20 persons, including actor Rosanno Brazzi and his wife, attended the 15-minute Episcopal service.

Herman Meierjürgen, Portland, chairman of the Fish Commission, suggested the state should concentrate its salmon propagation efforts on streams south of the Columbia. He said dam construction has reduced the chance that salmon would return to the Columbia.

He also said that salvage timber operations on the Tillamook Burn has resulted in clogging of some coastal streams. Rollin E. Bowles, Portland, game commissioner, said the Fra-

ser River in British Columbia is a good example of how salmon runs can be restored.

The committee indicated it would approve the legislation.

Permit Bill Superseded

SALEM (AP) — A Senate-passed bill to abolish state liquor purchase permits apparently is dead.

A new bill, introduced in the House Monday, would keep the Senate bill's provision for identification cards for persons between 21 and 25 years old. But it would keep the permits, too.

Rep. Robert L. Ellstrom, R-Salem, chairman of the House Alcoholic Control Committee, said the new bill would be given precedence over the Senate bill. He is one of the sponsors of the new bill.

Ellstrom said he objects to the Senate bill because abolishing the permits would cost \$600,000 a biennium in revenue. The cities get half of it.

Prosperity Fund Grows Slowly

PORTLAND (AP) — Thirty-seven years ago the Portland News, a newspaper no longer in existence, deposited \$1,000 in the Ladd & Tilton Bank and called it the Portland Prosperity Fund. The newspaper directed that the money, with accumulated interest, be given to the city of Portland in 200 years—or sooner if it reached \$100,000.

City budget officer James M. Setterberg took a look at the fund today and said it stood at \$2,100, and at the end of the 200-year period would be \$53,000 if it continues to draw 2 per cent interest. The \$100 million estimate was presumably based on a higher interest rate.

CALLS OFF SEARCH

LONDON (UPI) — U.S. Air Force officials Monday called off the air search for an RB66 plane missing over the North Sea since Thursday and listed its three crewmen as missing. Community Council Dissolves

Board action of the Klamath Falls Community Council Monday officially ended activity of the organization when it was voted to dissolve the corporation. The board met at a noon luncheon session at the Winema Hotel.

Principal reasons outlined for dissolving the council were: Lack of interest by participating agencies; lack of cooperation on the part of community groups; council effort duplicated in many instances, the work already being done by other agencies or

groups; lack of community-wide problems actually demanding the resources of the council.

Funds remaining in the council treasury following dissolution and payment of all outstanding accounts will be turned over to the United Fund for distribution to local member agencies. Slightly more than \$200 will be available for this purpose. It was reported by Wilbur Womer, treasurer of the organization.

GETS LEGAL CUSTODY
