Yreka Woman Given Post

YREKA—Siskiyou County Clerk Mrs. Rachel N. Cordes has been elected vice president of the Northern California Clerks Association at a recent meeting.

Mrs. Cordes achieved the position of county clerk in a brief nine years after she first arrived in Yreka in 1948, and seven years from the time she was first employed in the county offices in 1950.

Mrs. Cordes was born at St. Mary's, Ohio, July 1, 1903. She first moved with her parents, the Reverend and Mrs. J. C. Needles, in 1906, when her father entered the ministry with the Methodist Church. She was graduated from North East High School in Kan-

sas City and chose business as a career.

On Dec. 16, 1935, she married J. E. "Gene" Cordes, and in 1939, they moved to San Diego and later to Los Angeles. They made their final long move to Yreka in 1948, with their small daughter, Charlene, who is now 15, an accomplished violinist, and a sophomore at Yreka High School.

Mrs. Cordes took her first position for the county in 1950, in the Yreka High School office. Six months later, she became a member of the county sheriff's office as secretary and matron, at which time she was the only woman employe in the department. In 1953, she became a deputy clerk, under the late county clerk, Waldo Smith. In recognition of her abilities and professional integrity, the Siskiyou County Board of Supervisors appointed her to the position of county clerk at the time of Mr. Smith's death in 1957, assuming her duties on Oct. 15 of that year.
