

WILL JOIN FLEET

MANILA (UPI) — Sixteen U.S. warships will join the 7th fleet in Far Eastern waters Saturday in the largest such movement in four years, the Navy announced Tuesday.

The Navy said the move was a "normal rotational relief" operation. The aircraft carriers Ranger and Yorktown, the heavy cruiser Los Angeles, the guided missile frigate Conz and 12 destroyers will take part.

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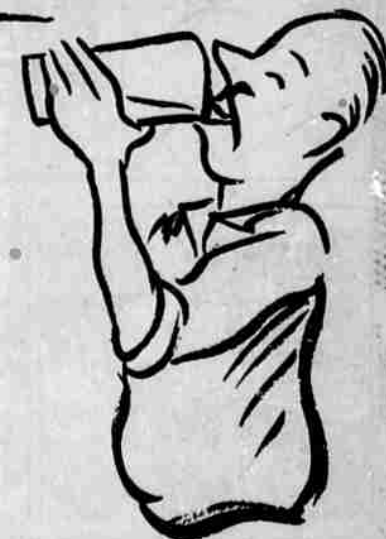
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
