Wilderness Sponsors Hope For House Okay

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sponsors of the controversial Senate-passed wilderness area bill looked forward hopefully Thursday to similar approval in the House next year.

The Senate passed the measure, opposed by ranching, mining and timber interests in the West, by a 78-8 roll call vote Wednesday night after two days of debate.

The measure would set up a national wilderness preservation system with its Senate backers said might ultimately comprise 35 to 45 million acres of the most primitive areas of national forests, parks, game refuges and other public land.

Sen. Clinton Anderson, D-N.M., Interior Committee chairman who introduced the bill, hailed Senate passage as "testimony that this nation regards preservation of a part of its sterner regions as a solemn trust to future generations."

"Support for the wilderness system came from members of both parties and was widespread among many groups across the nation," Anderson said in a statement issued here.

"I am optimistic about its future in the House," Anderson concluded.

Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, who managed the bill for its supporters during Senate debate, said its passage would give the House Committee on Interior an opportunity to conduct hearings on next session with reasonable prospect of obtaining final congressional approval next year.

Senate passage followed quickly after the defeat, 33-53, of a key amendment by Sen. Gordon Allott, R-Colo., to require an act of Congress for the inclusion of each area in the wilderness system.

Sen. Thomas Fuchel, R-Calif., told the Senate adoption of the amendment would be a tragedy and would "emasculate the bill."
