Practical Nurses Meet in Klamath Sept. 12-14

With the approaching 11th annual Oregon Licensed Practical Nurses' Association state meeting to be held Sept. 12, 13 and 14, officers of Area No. 8, OLPNA have announced some of the purposes of the organization. Mrs. E. Vaughn Thielman is president.

The state meeting will headquarter at the Winema Hotel and will bring representatives from many state areas.

Through OLPNA licensed practical nurses work for the improvement of practical nursing, the economic and general welfare of LPNs, and the health needs of the American people.

OLPNA, the only state membership organization of licensed practical nurses, was organized in 1950 and incorporated in the state of Oregon.

Purposes of the organization are to preserve and foster the ideal of comprehensive care for the ill and the aged; to secure recognition and effective utilization of the skills of licensed practical nurses; to promote the welfare and inter-

ests of the nursing group and to improve standards of practical nursing.

In addition LPN members cooperate with other groups concerned with better patient care; they serve as a clearing house for information on practical nursing, further the continued improvement in the education of licensed practical nurses, organize leadership training programs and promote the effective functioning of constituent areas.

The three-day convention will bring State OLPNA President Mrs. Kathryn Burton, Eugene, and other state officials to Klamath Falls.

Tom Trial Bail Forfeited

Failing to appear in district court for a scheduled "Peeping Tom" trial cost a 29-year-old Klamath Falls auto mechanic at least \$100.

The mechanic, Herbert T. Brooks, had pleaded not guilty to a charge of violating the privacy of another person and Judge Hal F. Cox had set Sept. 5 as the trial date.

Brooks failed to appear Tuesday and the judge forfeited \$100 bail that Brooks had posted. The judge also had the option of issuing a bench warrant for Brooks' arrest.

Brooks was accused of looking in the window on Aug. 14 of a house at 109 Martin Street owned by Lloyd Baker. City police said they also suspected Brooks of another similar incident.

Regular Army Status Open To National Guard, Reserves

Army Recruiting headquarters in Portland announced Thursday that certain grades of Army Reserve and National Guardsmen are now eligible for enlistment in the regular Army.

Personnel in grades E-1 (Pvt.) through E-7 (M.Sgt.) may, if otherwise qualified, be enlisted up to and including grade E-4. Men, grade E-5 through E-7 presenting an approved application, may be transferred.

Applications from the Continental U.S. Army headquarters for re-enlistment and Sixth Army headquarters for National Guardsmen, applicants immediately providing they have necessary approved authority for enlistment from their organizations.

Lt. Col. Arthur G. May, commanding officer of Army Recruiting Main Station in Portland said all stations in his area will accept applicants immediately providing they have necessary approved authority for enlistment from their organizations.
