Shasta Garden Club Plans Garden Show

MONTAGUE—"It's A Circus," is the theme chosen by the Shasta Valley Garden Club, for its first annual garden and hobby show to be held on Sunday, Sept. 17, from 1 to 6 p.m. in the Garden Hall, a room in the old Montague Elementary School, reserved for the club's use.

Plans for the event were discussed at the organization's meeting held Friday, Sept. 1, at the home of Mrs. Jessie Terwilliger in Little Shasta, who was assisted by hostess duties by Mrs. Alta Allen, Mrs. Erik Hansen, president, conducted the business session.

The circus theme will be carried out by identifying the various classifications by the title of a circus animal or act.

Under Section 1, the classes are divided as follows: Class 1, elephants, will feature mass arrangements; Class 2, camels, dry arrangements; Class 3, trained seals, will consist of arrangements using water, mirrors, sea shells, and driftwood. Class 4, "Emmett Kelly," is to be all green, using foliage only, and Class 5, "Peppermint," will feature miniature arrangements and five inches using both living and dry materials. Class 6, giraffes, will be conversation pieces, with vertical arrangements 12 inches or more. Class 5, dandelions, is for men only.

Class 6 is to be "Animals on Parade," featuring a circus animal. In a special class, under the title "He Flies Through The Air," will be line design exhibits.

Hobbies, which may consist of anything and everything, should be at the Garden Hall on Saturday, Sept. 8, and someone will be present to receive these exhibits between 1 and 5 p.m.

Friday afternoon's program was a talk and display on rocks and minerals by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas George of Yreka who have been collecting in this field for the last five years.

In addition to discussing the plans for the flower and hobby show, Mrs. Rita Prather, past president of the garden club, reported that she is still investigating the matter of placing a Blue Star Memorial on Highway 97, in California, south of Oregon.
