Churches from throughout the community will wear their hats to public schools when Klamath Council of Churches stages its first "Public Schools Welcome Tea" Sunday.

Teachers, staff and board members of schools in Klamath Falls, suburban area and Oregon Technical Institute are invited to the event. Guests will "come and go" from 3 to 6 p.m. Sunday in the social hall of First Presbyterian Church, 601 Pine Street.

Although sponsored by the Klamath Council, spiritual leaders and members from all churches have been invited to help welcome the teachers.

"It is a recognition on the part of the churches of the place and function of the public school in the community," said Rev. Ralph H. Richardson, pastor of the First Methodist Church and president of the Council of Churches.

Bolivia Art, Crafts Shown

Christian converts among the large Indian population of the Andes in Bolivia are eager for the church life and accompanying education, a South American Missionary explained at First Methodist Church Sept. 3.

Dr. John Herrick, who served the Bolivian mission field from 1917 to 1953, described the missionary efforts and church lives of the Indians, world famous for their round-crowned high hats.

Along with adopting Christianity and education, many of the people are installing glass windows in their dark homes, adopting sanitary measures, and raising vegetables to supplement their fish and barley diets.

Dr. Herrick showed examples of primitive loom weaving, knitted bags and purses and dolls dressed in the typical fashion—women in wrap-around skirts and men in ponchos. Most of the clothing is provided by vicuna, llama and other types of the camel family which inhabit the lofty land.

OSU Hosts Conference On Change In Churches

CORVALLIS — Oregon State University will host a special conference on changes taking place in town and country churches Oct. 9-11.

Results of a survey of the changes and problems created by these changes will be spotlighted at the 1961 Oregon Town and Country Church Conference.

A second session of the conference will be held on the Southern Oregon College at Ashland this year. All speakers and program events will be moved to the Southern Oregon area for the special session Oct. 12-13.

Completed survey forms are now being received from churches over Western Oregon, according to Mrs. Mabel C. Mack, assistant director of the OSU cooperative extension service and conference chairman.

Survey results will be reported the first day of the conference. Then, speakers and discussion groups will examine changes reported and seek ways to renew the vitality of churches faced with problems created by these changes.

Key speaker at this year's conference will be Dr. E. W. Mueller, secretary for Town and Country, National Lutheran Church, Chicago.

Other speakers will include Philip Aylesworth, program relationships coordinator for the USDA Extension Service, Washington, D.C.; Rt. Rev. Damian Jentges, O.S.B., Abbot, Mt. Angel Abbey, Miss Jean Lovejoy, Sears, Roebuck Foundation, Seattle; and Dr. G. Burton Wood, head of the OSU department of agricultural economics.

The Oregon Town and Country Church Conference, held each year to study ways to improve the effectiveness of churches that serve rural people, is sponsored by the Oregon Council of Churches, Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, Oregon State University and Cooperative Extension Service, Oregon Farm Bureau, Oregon State Grange, Oregon State Farmers Union and Oregon Home Economics Extension Council.

Camp Chapel Fund Begins

CAMP RILEA — Oregon Army National Guard officials have launched a drive for a new worship chapel at Camp Rilea at Warrenton near Astoria.

"A Chapel For You in '62" is theme of the drive which is receiving contributions from guardsmen now taking active duty training at Camp Rilea. Volunteer labor will be used during the ensuing year, according to Maj. Gen. Alfred E. Hintz, Oregon adjutant general.

Goal of the drive is \$4,000 cash—about 40 per cent of the total chapel cost—and the remainder in labor.

Camp Rilea, which this summer served more than 2,000 National Guardsmen, has no permanent chapel, but holds services in a theater building on the post. Men with Oregon Air National Guard, 362nd Combat Engineer, 249th Air Defense Artillery and supporting units use the coastal military establishment.
