

Jane Ann Larkin Weds Darryl Everett Johnson

On Aug. 20 in St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Jane Ann Larkin, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. B. Larkin, became the bride of Darryl Everett Johnson of Portland in a double ring ceremony officiated by the Rev. Robert L. Greene.

Altar bouquets of white gladioli and blue delphinium set the color scheme for the 2 o'clock wedding and country club reception following. White satin shoes marked the center aisle of the church.

The bridegroom is the son of Mrs. Robert Olsen of Portland and Oscar Johnson of Tracyton, Wash.

Traditional organ music was played by Linda Hanville. She also accompanied Lt. Terry Hannon when he sang "Wedding Prayer" and "O Perfect Love."

Just before the bridal party entered, Mrs. Larkin was escorted to her seat by her nephew, James Kenyon of McMinnville. She chose for her daughter's wedding a frost-dusted pink pure silk sheath dress with crushed cummerbund, caught at the back with two roses. A small floral hat of roses and tulips and corsage of lavender orchids completed her attire.

The bride was escorted to the altar and given in marriage by her father. Her traditional floor length white satin gown was strikingly simple in design with snug fitting bodice, three quarter length sleeves and full skirt. Only ornamentation was seed pearls and iridescent sequins on the imported Alencon lace at the scoop neckline and on the sleeves. A small lace cap with the same trim held the tiered shoulder length French illusion veil. A single strand of pearls was a gift of the bridegroom. For something borrowed she carried the prayer book of Mrs. Franklin L. Weaver, who had carried it at her wedding. This was covered with white orchids and Stephanotis on satin streamers. She also carried a linen handkerchief made for her by Mrs. Jack Nixon.

Leah Lamb of Klamath Falls was the maid of honor. Her frock was of white silk organza over tulle with scoop neckline, brief sleeves and princess style bodice. A full bouffant skirt was gathered to a narrow blue, white and green embroidered band at the hip line ending in a bow at the back. On her head was a short, veiled crown of blue flowers designed to match the band of her dress. She carried a single large blue butterfly made from chrysanthemum petals.

Heirlooms from the bride's family graced the table and served as floral containers about the room. On each side of the wedding cake were bouquets of yellow roses in cut glass and silver epergnes. The small pewter pitcher with gold strike roses in the center of the table has centered the serving table of six generations of weddings in the bride's family, the first being in a small town in England.
