

Weddings And Entertaining Of Visitors Make Late Summer Days Busy Ones



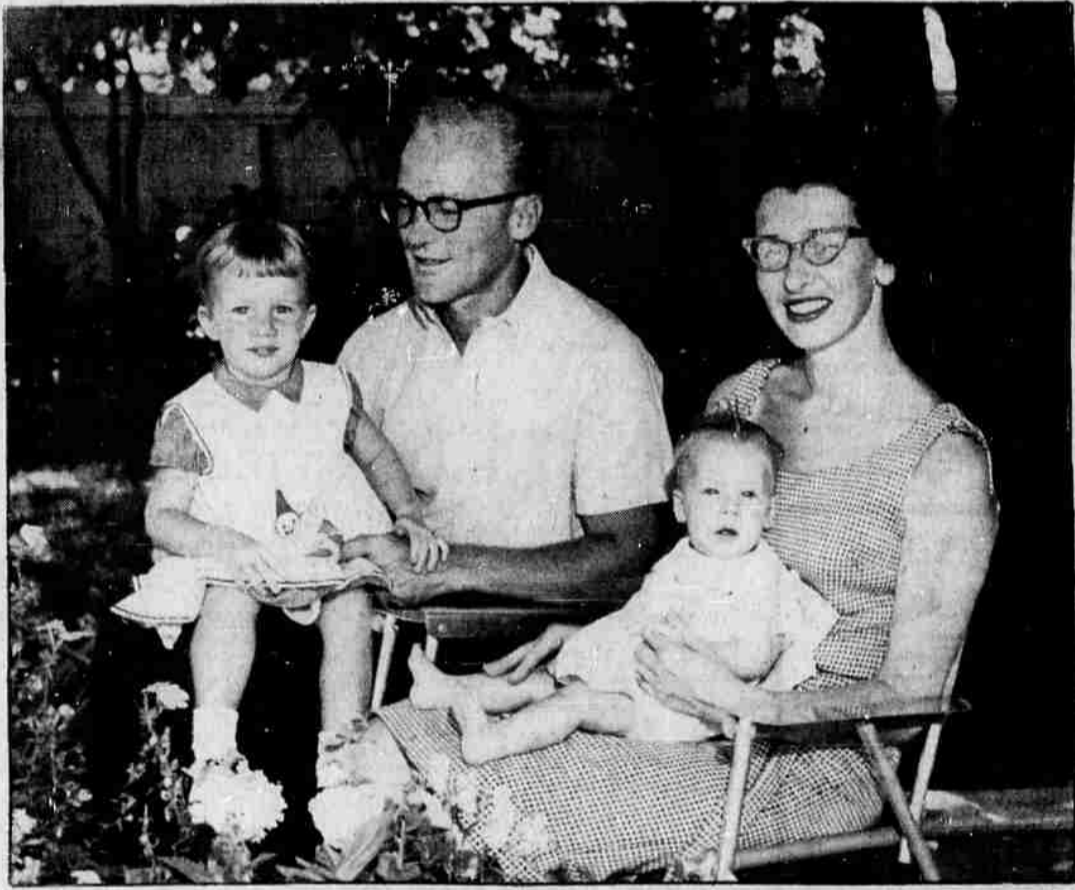
