

Story Variations In Gorge Death Eyed By Jury

MADRAS, Ore. (AP)—The murder trial of Jeannette June Freeman, 20, moved forward today after most of Monday was taken up with legal arguments in the chambers of Circuit Judge Robert H. Foley.

It appeared that the prosecution had won its point, because soon after attorneys returned to the courtroom, the prosecution read a lengthy statement in which Miss Freeman told of events leading to the killing of the two children of

children's mother bludgeoned them in the back seat of a car about a mile from Peter Skene Ogden State Park.

A statement read into the record Monday said the beatings took place about a mile outside the park at an overpass on Highway 97, south of Madras.

Newell said the formal statements differed from versions given by Miss Freeman in conversations with him on May 23 and 26.

Mrs. Nuez has confessed in open court the slaying of her daughter. The mother is expected to be a prosecution witness against Miss Freeman.

Lawmakers Plan Suit

SALEM (AP) — Legislative leaders plan a new court suit to collect their legislative expenses.

This is expected to be the result of Monday's opinion by Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton that the lawmakers can not collect for secretarial service, rent and telephone calls when their offices are used for legislative work.

The 1961 Legislature passed a resolution to pay expenses to the legislators, but not personal expenses such as food and lodging. It imposed a \$75 monthly ceiling when the Legislature is in session, and \$150 when not in session.

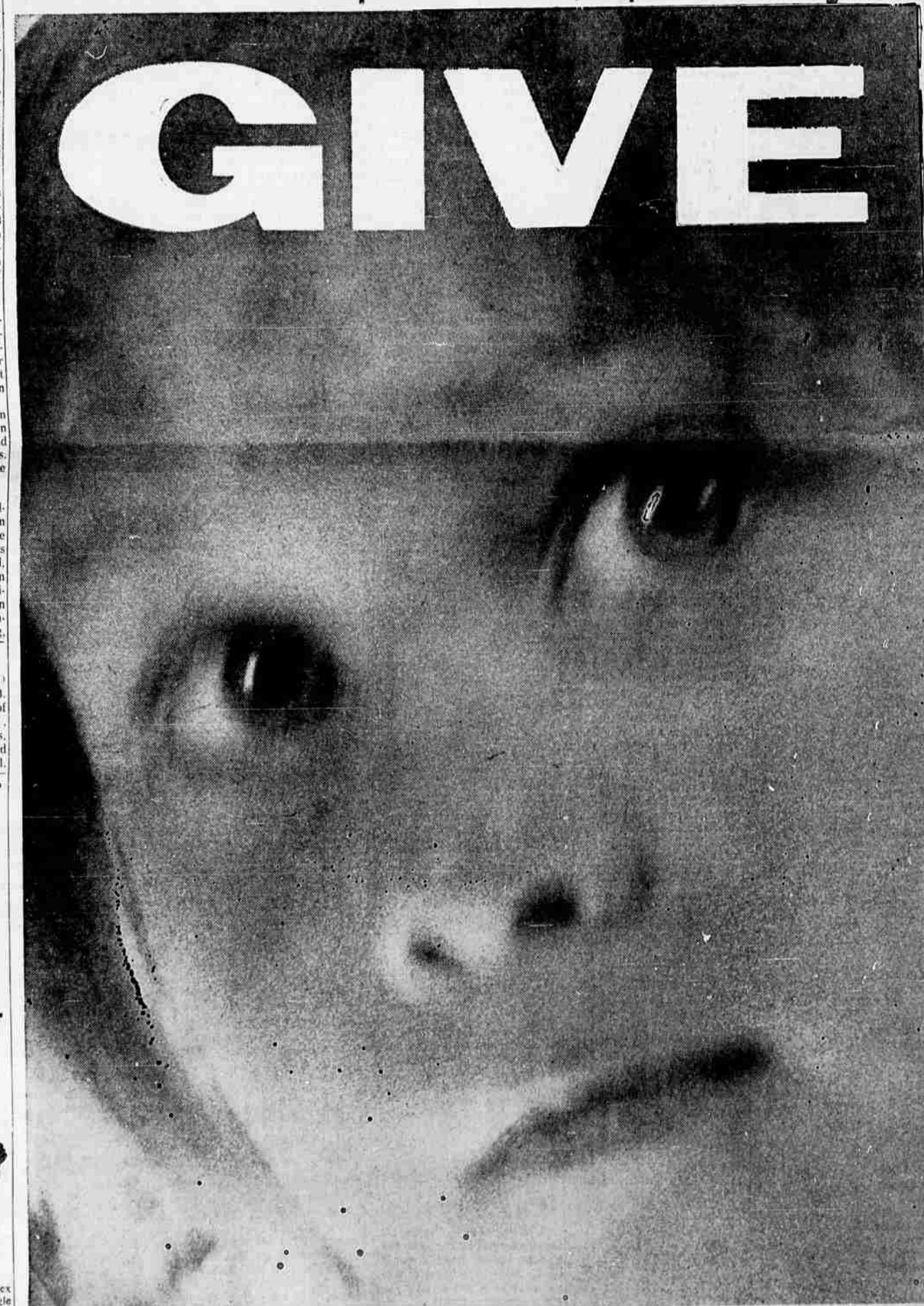
