NEW YORK (AP)—Steady declines among a host of industrial issues knocked the stock market down late this afternoon.

Volume for the day was estimated at 2.9 million shares compared with 3.4 million on Friday. The decline was attributed in part to the Jewish holidays.

A goodly number of blue chip issues were included in a growing list of key issues off a point or more.

Corporate and U.S. government bonds were mostly lower.

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Highway Signs Eyed By Dunsmuir Council

DUNSMUIR — The city council agreed last week to take steps to indicate properly the motel and business area in the town now known as North Dunsmuir.

No objection was voiced by the council except Councilman Floyd Creason, who thought the request should have been made before the city erected new street signs this summer. The motel men promised to finance the new street signs and a lot of consent of the residents to the new street name if the council would negotiate with the division of highways.

In other business, the council agreed to restore the street name plaque to Scarlett Way to the stone archway at the entrance to Shasta Retreat. It okayed the final contract between the city and the school district selling the old engine house for the purpose of school bus housing.

In response to a question from Mayor David McClintock, City Clerk Elizabeth Cavin explained land cleared at the sewage disposal plant for the street department to dump debris is subject to burning restrictions by the forest service and cannot be used as a general dump.

Louis Grove Rites Held

ALTURAS — Archie Close, 80, died in the Modoc Medical Center, Sept. 6. Close was born April 28, 1881, in New York.

A pioneer automobile man in Alturas he was responsible for delivering some of the first automobiles into Modoc County. He has resided here since 1910.

Mr. Close was also known as a confirmed naturalist and after 30 years in the garage business worked for the Fish and Game Commission and the forest service.

He was a member of the Odd Fellows Lodge, Masonic Lodge and one of the founders of the Modoc Gem and Mineral Society.
