

# Miss America Asks Hubby For Divorce

DENVER, Colo. (AP)—Gary Nady, the former Colorado football star who married Miss America in 1958, Marilyn Vanderbur, said Monday night, "Marilyn is suing me for divorce."

In New York City, where she is making television appearances, Miss Vanderbur refused to comment.

The desk at the Savoy Hilton Hotel first told reporters she had asked not to be disturbed until 10 a.m. At that time the hotel said she had checked out without leaving a forwarding address.

Nady, 27, football coach at Parsons College in Iowa, said he had received a telephone call from his wife's Denver attorney Monday night.

In a telephone interview with the Rocky Mountain News, Nady said later it was "the biggest shock of my life."

The couple was married June 1 in a well-publicized ceremony at St. John the Evangelist Catholic church in Denver.

Marilyn, 23, has made numerous television appearances for the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. She was TV hostess for the Miss America pageant at Atlantic City, N.J., last weekend.

She and Nady met at the University of Colorado as students and became engaged at Christmas 1959. Three months later, Miss Vanderbur broke the engagement, saying "Gary and I just weren't able to work things out."

But last March their wedding plans were announced.

"I thought it was an ideal marriage," Nady said Monday night. "I always felt she was happy here in Fairfield (Iowa). The only thing I can think of is that since she's been gone, some new horizons in her career have presented themselves."

# Knight's Hat In Ring For Governor's Post

SACRAMENTO (UPI)—Ex-Gov. Goodwin J. Knight's announcement that he wants his old job back set the stage today for a free-for-all in 1962 involving Richard M. Nixon.

Knight declared his candidacy for the Republican nomination for governor Monday, bringing to three the number of announced GOP aspirants.

Nixon is expected to reveal within two weeks whether he will seek the nomination next year. He publicly has said he is reluctant to get in the gubernatorial race but has been under extreme pressure to do so by GOP leaders from former President Dwight D. Eisenhower on down.

Even if he does not run for governor, Nixon, the titular head of his party, will be forced to take an active part in the 1962 campaign if the Republicans hope to unseat the incumbent, Democratic Gov. Edmund G. Brown.

The Democratic gubernatorial nomination but almost everyone in both parties assumes that Brown again will be the candidate and will be opposed for the Democratic nomination.

Knight's entry into the race poses a problem for Nixon.

If the former vice president decides to run for governor, he risks a party-splitting fight with Knight, who still is smarting over the fact he was maneuvered out of a chance to run for reelection for governor in 1958 and forced to make an unsuccessful bid for the U.S. Senate.

If Nixon does not run, his position as the head of his party and a potential presidential candidate in 1964 or 1968 will be at stake in his home state. Republicans were thrown out of most offices by the Democrats in 1958 and the GOP desperately wants to turn the tables next year. Many national Republican leaders are relying on Nixon to do the job.

**Knight Intends to Run**

Knight made it clear in his announcement of candidacy that he intends to run no matter what Nixon does.

"I'm in the race all the way," he said.

Knight already has gotten in some digs at Nixon.

He told Sacramento newsmen last week that he didn't think Nixon could beat Brown for the governorship and he said it was "ridiculous" for Nixon to say that he would run only if it were necessary to save the state from the Democrats.

"There is no such thing as an indispensable man," Knight said, referring to Nixon's statement.

Brown, obviously happy over the prospects of a Knight-Nixon clash in the June primary next year, told newsmen he thought Knight announced nine months before the election "in a transparent attempt to keep Richard Nixon out of the race."

"But I will leave it to those two worthies to fight their own battles," Brown said.

## Thieves May Ask Ransom

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP)—A ransom demand may come, police say, from the thief who locked a maid in a closet and stole four paintings insured for \$670,000 from a Bel-Air mansion.

The FBI joined the investigation Monday on the theory that paintings so costly would be transported across state lines.

The thief, posing as a florist and concealing a revolver in a bouquet, took the \$2-million collection at the home of industrialist David E. Bright.

The possibility of a ransom demand was seen in a mysterious call to Bright's telephone answering service, placed before the theft was made public.

"Don't contact the police or insurance company and you'll get your paintings back," a man's voice said.

Stolen were Pablo Picasso's "Sabastian," insured for \$400,000; Picasso's "Looking Through a Window," \$100,000; Amadeo Modigliani's "Portrait of a Woman," \$150,000, and an untitled abstract by Afro Basaldella valued at \$20,000.

## Typhoon Kills 17 Formosans

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—Typhoon Pamela smashed across northern Formosa today, killing at least 17 persons, leaving thousands homeless, and ravaging this capital of Nationalist China.

The great storm, with maximum winds of 135 miles an hour, was the worst in the memory of long-time residents of Formosa.

None of the Americans in this city of 320,000 was injured, but some were isolated by flash floods.

## Writ Refused Convicted Man

SAN RAFAEL (UPI)—L. Ewing Scott, sent to San Quentin Prison for the murder of his wife, asked Marin County Superior Court Monday for a writ of habeas corpus and was refused.

Scott, 63, claimed that a prison employee delayed four days in the mailing of a letter he wrote to the state Adult Authority. According to Scott, the authority might have granted a hearing if it had received the letter before its Aug. 20 meeting.

He said he gave it to an unnamed prison employe to mail Aug. 14, but that it was not posted until Aug. 18.

Scott was sent to prison after a lengthy Los Angeles trial for the slaying of his wife. Her body has never been found.
