Republicans Close Ranks

WASHINGTON (AP)—Republican congressional leaders expect to expand their liaison with New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller as a part of their efforts to close GOP ranks before the 1968 campaign. Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen of Illinois said he had suggested to Rockefeller that frequent contacts between the governor and the Senate and House chieftains would benefit the party generally. He is in a pre-eminent spot in the party and among the governors," Dirksen said. "It will be helpful for us to have his views."

Dirksen has conferred several times recently with former President Dwight D. Eisenhower but his contacts with congressional leaders have been few. Supplementing his observations, Dirksen said that he has frequent meetings with Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., a spokesman for GOP conservatives who is considered a possible rival of Rockefeller for the 1964 Republican presidential nomination. Dirksen noted at an informal news conference that nearly a score of Republicans had met with former Vice President Richard M. Nixon, the 1960 nominee, on the latter's recent visit to Washington.

Courts Have Good Year

SALEM (AP) — Oregon's circuit courts made continuing progress in the year ended June 30 in bringing their dockets toward current cases, John R. McCullough, administrative assistant to Chief Justice William McAllister, reported Monday. On June 30, he said, only 7 per cent of the pending civil cases were more than two years old. The figures were 10.9 per cent a year earlier, and 13.5 per cent two years before. He said Grant, Morrow, Sherman and Wallowa counties had the best record, with no cases more than two years old. Multnomah County had a 3.2 per cent figure. Counties with the poorest record were Linn, 14 per cent; Harney, 15.3; Malheur, 15.5; Josephine, 16.8; Klamath, 16.9; Hood River, 17.1; and Jefferson, 23.6. Percentages for other counties include: Umatilla, 12; Marion, 7.9; Lane, 10.6; Douglas, 12.2.

Coats, Ties May Be Off

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP) — School authorities — with a probable assist from the thermometer — will decide whether the boys at Hillhouse High will have to continue wearing coats and ties. "Phew!" the New Haven School Board said Monday night after hearing that Principal Robert T. LeVine had sent several boys home for not following his sartorial directive. The order is "unreasonable" in such hot weather, one member complained as the board asked an assistant superintendent to discuss the issue with LeVine. A decision is expected today. LeVine, whose school was one of the first in the country to ban bluejeans and ducktail haircuts, said he hoped he could keep his policy — with allowance for "oppressive" weather conditions. "I believe that a fine appearance makes for a fine student," he said.

King Shuffles Arabia Cabinet

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP)—King Saud of Saudi Arabia reshuffled his Cabinet Monday in an apparent move to patch up differences with his brother and ex-premier, Crown Prince Faisal. Mecca radio announced a royal decree naming Saud's nephew, Prince Faisal ben Turki ben Abdul Aziz, minister of the interior and dismissing his brother, Prince Talal ben Abdul Aziz, from his post as minister of finance and economy, among other Cabinet changes.
