3 Dams Seen Fishing Aid

PORTLAND (AP)—A state Fish Commission expert reported Wednesday that Rogue River fishing would be improved by the three dams proposed there by the Army Engineers.

William D. Clothier, water resources analyst for the commission, said in a study for the commission that some spawning grounds would be lost but that this would be overcome by improved flow and water temperature.

Assured stream flow is one of the greatest needs of salmon and steelhead runs in the Rogue, Clothier said.

Clothier recommended that the commission favor construction of the dams at Lost Creek and Elk Creek on the upper Rogue and on the Applegate River.

The commission scheduled a meeting with the state Game Commission Sept. 21 to discuss the matter.

Give-Away Hawaii Trip Stops At California

ST. LOUIS (UPI)—A suburban woman testified Wednesday she was able to travel only to California after winning a "millionaire's trip to Hawaii" on a radio station's give-away program.

Mrs. Raymond S. Varble, St. Ann, testified at an FCC hearing in which station KWK was ordered to show cause why its operating license should not be revoked.

Mrs. Varble said in May, 1959, her number was called out by the station, and she called within the 60 seconds allowed to verify that she was listening to the program.

The station announced her prize as "a millionaire's vacation in Hawaii—a two-week stay for two people with all expenses paid."

Mrs. Varble said she later discovered that all she really was entitled to was plane transportation to Hawaii, and a six-day stay at a hotel there. She said her expenses and food in Hawaii were not to be paid for.

Mrs. Varble said she wanted to take the trip in August, 1959, but was told she could not get plane reservations until after Sept. 15. She said she was put off from month to month, though she called once a week to inquire. She said the airline agency handling the prize trips finally told her she could go to Hawaii in May, 1960.

Civil Rights Gets Okay

WASHINGTON (AP)—Congress is expected, the commission would have died in November.

The commission's new two-year lease on life was a provision in an appropriations bill passed in quick order Wednesday by the House and Senate.

First the House agreed by a 300-106 vote to add the extension provision to the bill. Much of the opposition came from Southern Democrats.

Then, the House passed the bill by voice vote and sent it to the Senate. The Senate, by voice vote, sent the measure on to the President.

Over-all, the bill provides \$746,422,550 to finance the State and Justice departments, the federal courts and the U.S. Information Agency. The total was \$39,468,652 below Kennedy's requests.
