

Japan Hit By Nancy, 77 Dead

TOKYO (AP)—Typhoon Nancy churned across Japan late Saturday, leaving scores of casualties and widespread damage in densely populated areas of this island nation.

By nightfall, the center of the giant, Pacific-born storm had moved over the main island of Honshu into the Japan Sea.

Floods and high tides threatened in the wake of winds up to 112 m.p.h.

The semigovernmental Japan Broadcasting Co. listed 77 persons dead, 48 missing and 1,017 injured. It said 27,356 houses had been destroyed or damaged heavily.

The National Police Agency listed 45 persons dead, 53 missing and 617 injured. The police said 2,508 houses were destroyed and 188,000 flooded.

The storm's path carried it away from Tokyo. The capital had buttoned up and prepared for the worst. Theaters, restaurants and bars were closed. Stores were shuttered and protective boards were nailed across glass doors.

Accident Kills Pendleton Man

PENDLETON (AP)—A highway collision killed Harold G. Gully, 52, Pendleton, on Highway 30 about six miles east of Pendleton today.

His car was demolished in a collision with a fuel tank truck.

The truck driver, George W. Boardman, 51, Hermiston, said he was eastbound on a three-lane stretch when the westbound Gully suddenly veered over and crashed into the truck. Boardman was not hurt.

It was the 29th traffic death of the month in Oregon and the 336th of the year on the Associated Press list.

SALEM (AP)—A teen-age Salem boy en route to a football game was wounded critically as he cut across a motel lot in south Salem Friday night.

In critical condition at Good Samaritan Hospital in Portland is Everett H. Dewese, 15, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence E. Dewese.

In the Salem city jail is Fred Larsen, 74, the motel operator. Officers said Larsen admitted shooting at three youths with a pellet gun as they cut through the driveway of his motel. He said he had been having some trouble

with juveniles breaking bottles in his driveway recently.

He said the three boys Friday night cut across his property twice.

Jury Acquits Lugo Of Rape

A circuit court jury of eight men and four women unanimously voted for acquittal late Friday afternoon of Lawrence P. Lugo, 19, on a statutory rape charge.

They deliberated only 45 minutes before reaching their verdict. This concluded a four-day trial which stemmed from an incident involving a 15-year-old girl July 2 near her parents' summer home at Lake of the Woods.

Community Hall Proposal Heard

YREKA — During last week's meeting of the Yreka City Council, the board received an exploratory proposal to purchase the old Community Hall building on Fourth Street from Rev. Clyde E. Teel, minister of the Yreka Methodist Church.

Rev. Teel stated that the church would put in improvements on the building, to cost about \$50,000, which would include improving the grounds for the development of a Christian center to conduct group activity such as it was being used for now.

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Sonic Boom Taken For Bomb Blast By Las Vegas Folks

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP)—A sonic boom that sounded like a nuclear blast is confusing people in Las Vegas.

Many believe the boom—which was heard 28 minutes after Friday's underground nuclear explosion—was the blast.

Police and news agency switchboards were jammed with reports of the explosion—but they all

came after the sonic noise, made by an airplane breaking the sound barrier.

A radio station, claiming it knew there would be a nuclear test, went on the air with its "scoop" about the explosion when it heard the sonic boom.

The test blast, muffled underground, was not heard here, 45 miles southeast of the proving ground.

The plane that caused the boom still was not identified. But an Air Force spokesman said nearby radar had traced a craft traveling at supersonic speed at the time of the boom.

Despite close-mouthed AEC security, apparently there were no leaks. The radio station said it had wind of the test, and another newsmen stationed himself within sight of the test area.

He reported a puff of smoke, but officials would not comment on it. This was later described as a dust cloud, caused by rocks rolling down a slope following the blast.

The test site was closed to newsmen.

Pendleton Rodeo Ends

PENDLETON (AP)—Cars clogged highways Friday as 25,000 persons waited the start of the Westward Ho Parade, one of the highlights of the annual Pendleton Round-Up, which ends today.

After the bands, costumed Indians and numerous riding groups had completed their part of the show, 240-pound cowboy Harry Charters of Melba, Idaho, took the spotlight in arena competition.

Charters, the defending all-around champion, took the lead in calf-roping, wound up third in the first round of bulldogging and fourth in the second round.

Harley May, who led the bulldogging division by throwing two steers in 18.8 seconds, appeared to have the only chance of catching Charters in point standings.

Glenn Evans, a New Mexico entrant, wound up in the hospital with face and leg injuries after his foot got caught in a stirrup during the saddle bronc-riding event.

Sammy Flynn, La Grande, Ore., looked like a good bet to win the bareback bronc-riding competition. He won the first go-round with 172 points, and followed with a 170-pointer.

Jim Snively of Oklahoma led the steer ropers, Marty Wood of Canada took the lead in saddle bronc-riding, and Lawrence Hutchinson of Calgary, Canada led in the dangerous Brahma Bull riding competition.

Jim Charles of California had a close call in that event when a bull tossed him into the air and turned on him when he landed.

Mistrial Held In Priest Case

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP)—A mistrial was declared Friday in the case of a Roman Catholic priest accused of trying to rape a college coed.

Dist. Court Judge Penn Jackson took the action after the jury reported it was deadlocked.

The Rev. John F. Feit is charged with assault with intent to rape Maria American Guerra, 21, as she knelt to pray in the Sacred Heart Church in Edinburg, Tex., on March 23, 1960.

Miss Guerra, a student at Pan American College at the time, testified Father Feit grabbed her from behind, tried to stuff a handkerchief into her mouth and threw her to the floor. She said he fled after she bit his finger.

Father Feit pleaded innocent. He did not testify.

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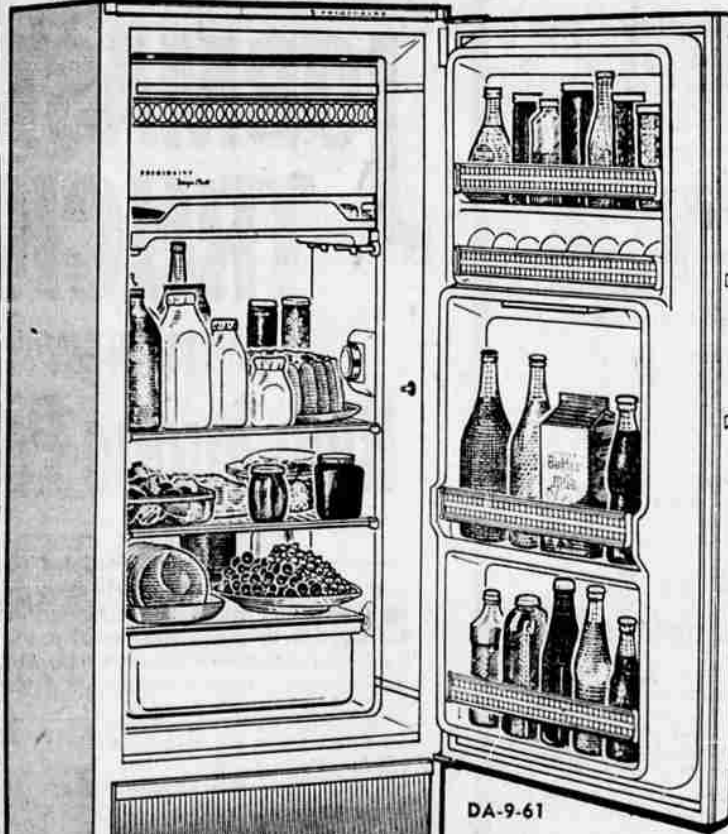
