'Shotgun' Offense Peppers Redskins

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—The San Francisco Forty Niners unlimbered their "shotgun" Sunday and peppered the Washington Redskins, 35-3, in their National Football League opener before 43,142 fans at Kezar Stadium.

It was hard to find fault with the defensive team, which held the Redskins to 37 yards rushing and 98 passing—but coach Red Hickey may oil up his shotgun offense a little, in spite of a very impressive showing.

Hickey isn't likely to forget that what happened to be a San Francisco powerhouse was operating against a Washington team which has lost 14 consecutive games.

Brodie Passes For 4

Quarterback John Brodie fired four touchdown passes to tie a Forty Niner record in the NFL set by Y. A. Tittle in 1953. The usually reliable Clyde Conner dropped a pass that would have given Brodie five scoring passes to tie an all-time Forty Niner record set by Frankie Albert in the old All-America Conference.

Brodie completed 16 of 22 passes for 237 yards and had one intercepted.

Monte Stickles was the leading pass receiver, snagging seven for

116 yards and two touchdowns. Conner grabbed five for 63 yards and one td, while J. D. Smith scored on the fourth aerial when Brodie found him all by himself near the Redskins goal line. Smith also scored on a short plunge.

However, the shotgun misfired when second string quarterback Bill Kilmer took over in the fourth period. He started off with three consecutive completed passes, but then bogged down.

Kilmer Rocked

Kilmer, who usually eats up the yardage from the spread formation, found himself eating the football as the Washington linebackers stormed through. However, he completed six out of nine passes and had two intercepted. He lost 23 yards on three pass plays that didn't quite make it.

Interception also stymied the Washington attack. Rookie quarterback Norman Snead lost aerials to Dave Baker, Eddie Dove and Bob Harrison. The Redskins kept their only score on a first period field goal by John Aveni from 29 yards out.

Next Sunday the Forty Niners go against the Green Bay Packers, defending champions of the Western Division.

KF Golfer Nails Ninth

PORTLAND (AP) — For the second straight year DeRoss Kinkade, a Seattle University senior from Cottage Grove, Ore., is the Oregon Golf Association's champion of Champions.

He had rounds of 67 and 74 Sunday for a 3 blow par 141. Jay Gorman, Portland, the Oregon junior champion, was three strokes back with 75-69.

Fourth was Ralph Dichter, Astoria, 74-73-147. Steve Millich, Salem, and Dave Smith, Portland, tied for fifth, each with 74-75-149.

Colts Rough On LA Rams

BALTIMORE (UPI)—The Los Angeles Rams, who were positive the once-powerful running attack of the aging Baltimore Colts had vanished with the retirement of Alan Ameche, today knew differently.

Despite week-long prophecies from Ram coach Bob Waterfield that Los Angeles could defeat the Colts by halting their passing game, Baltimore outgained the Rams rushing, scored two touchdowns running and won, 27-24, in the National Football League opener for both clubs.

Joe (The Jet) Perry, supposedly over the hill at the age of 34, gained more than 100 yards on the ground in augmenting quarterback John Unitas' passing. The combination, along with the consistent foot of Steve Myhra—who kicked two field goals—brought the Colts from behind for the victory.

The Rams, who next Saturday night return home to meet the Chicago Bears at the Coliseum, looked like they were going to shock the experts as they held a two-touchdown lead over the 10-point favorite Colts with less than three minutes to play in the first half.

But Perry, obtained by the Colts this season from the San Francisco Forty Niners, with whom he played for 11 seasons, teamed with Unitas and Myhra to rally Baltimore before a noisy crowd of 54,259.

Perry ran for 106 yards in 18 carries for an average of 5.9 yards a carry. Unitas passed for 132 yards and one touchdown, and he also scored on an eight-yard run. Myhra's second field goal, which came in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter, was a 39-yard kick and proved to be the winning margin.

The Rams played one of their best games of the season, installing a new lonesome end play to further confuse the Baltimore defenses, but in the end couldn't contain the slow-starting Baltimore attack.

Tom Wilson, taking advantage of Jon Arnett's status as a decoy, rushed for 118 yards in 15 carries for Los Angeles, and quarterback Zeke Bratkowski passed for 140 yards and two touchdowns.

Needing three more home runs in the next three games to break Babe Ruth's record of 60 in a 154-game season, such a request by the New York Yankees slugger sounds ridiculous. But the serious minded slugger said it with a straight face.

"I'm bushed," Maris repeated a remark he has made a number of times in the past two weeks.

"Record or not, I'm thinking of asking Ralph for a day off when-ever game Barber (Baltimore left-hander Steve Barber) pitches. He's rough on me. And I can sure use the rest."
