

Aid Asked For Young Borrowers

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—The President of the California Savings and Loan League, Oliver M. Chaburn, suggested Monday that young borrowers with potentially good futures be given some new breaks.

Chaburn, who is senior vice president of California Federal Savings, Los Angeles, said, "we might give a break to a young borrower by basing the down payment and the monthly payment during the first five years of the loan on the borrower's income."

He said the payments could be increased as the young person's income increased.

He told 800 delegates at the opening session of the 71st annual convention of the league that the industry should adopt a variable interest rate tied in with the cost of money.

He said that a variable rate is the basic plan used by the British building societies and also by a few savings and loan institutions here.

He explained that when the savings and loan increases its dividend one-quarter per cent, the interest rate on its outstanding home loans would be increased a like amount. The rate decreases on the same basis.

A borrower who obtained his loan when the savings and loans were paying dividends of 3 or 3½ per cent would not continue to have the use of that money over a longer period of time at a lesser rate than the person who made his loan when savings and loans were paying 4½ per cent dividends, he said.

It would stabilize home mortgage costs, he said.

General Clay Returns To Berlin! Promises City Will Remain Free

BERLIN (UPI)—Gen. Lucius D. Clay, hero of the 1948-49 blockade, flew into Berlin Tuesday as President Kennedy's representative with the promise that the city will remain free in the face of new Communist threats.

Clay returned here to help map Western strategy for the defense of Berlin. He received a triumphal welcome.

In a brief speech at Tempelhof Airport, main base during the blockade, Clay said:

"President Kennedy sent me because of his grave and deep interest and concern in the welfare and future of Berlin and its people."

"Once again he expressed our determination that Berlin and its people always will be free."

Clay flew here aboard a commercial flight of Pan American World Airways, a gesture he was understood to have made to stress the right of the three Western Allies to use the air corridors from West Germany to West Berlin for civil airliners.

Clay was accompanied here by West Berlin Mayor Willy Brandt. He conferred earlier in the day for an hour with West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer in Bonn, and then went on to Frankfurt and Berlin.

Clay had told Adenauer that the President was sending him to Berlin, adding that this "is an expression of his own great concern for the future of Berlin, for the population of Berlin."

Clay added he was "very proud to be in Germany again and to be returning to Berlin."

"It is a great comfort for us all," Adenauer told Clay, "for all Germany and particularly for Berlin that President Kennedy sent you here and that you accepted this task."

Western diplomats said Clay brings to his new job three great advantages: The confidence of the President, a first-hand knowledge

of the Russians, and the courage and ability to make on-the-spot decisions.

As Kennedy's representative with the rank of ambassador, Clay was expected to have a direct channel to the White House.

When Clay ran the American military government in Germany from 1945 to 1949, he was praised for his complete and thorough grasp of all problems that faced the ruined and defeated nation.

Titan Base Strike Ends

DENVER (UPI) — A wildcat walkout at a Titan missile base under construction near here ended Tuesday when the entire labor force showed up to work.

The walkout, which started Friday when 350 ironworkers walked off the job at all six missile launching complexes, ended as a hearing before President Kennedy's Missile Sites Labor Relations Committee was to get under way in Washington.

Labor Secretary Arthur Goldberg had ordered President John H. Lyons Sr. of the International Association of Bridge, Structural and Ornamental Ironworkers to have the men back on the job by Wednesday.

Most of the workers heeded the instructions Monday and only 116 failed to show up for work. But 30 of those returned later in the day, with the remainder reporting for work again this morning.

"Everybody showed up for work today," Lt. Col. Edgar Cavin of the Air Force Missile Base Command said Tuesday. "Everything is back to normal."

Construction at all six launching sites at the \$240 million Air Force intercontinental missile base near Denver was hampered during the weekend.

Cavin said the hearing in Washington would attempt to settle the dispute which touched off the walkout. The ironworkers protested the construction of protective fences around the sites by employees of the Amco Fence Co., Houston, Tex. They claimed the firm was not matching the local wage and fringe benefit scale.
