Klamath County Council of Churches will open its annual fall migrant ministry at Malin Sunday, according to Miss Sarah Hall Goodwin, director for the Oregon-Southern Idaho Migrant Ministry.

Miss Goodwin introduced Rev. and Mrs. Wallace M. Prowell, who will lead the work, at a meeting of the Council of Churches this week.
