EXPLANATIONS ACROSS

1. After HEARING a patient's complaints, a busy doctor may be very bored with the case. When a person is long-winded about his many ailments, chances are that a lot of his aches and pains are imaginary and the doctor feels that his time is being wasted. HEALING a patient's complaints, or ailments, is a challenge and a satisfaction to a doctor.

6. An uncompleted portrait may need just another DAB or two to make it come alive — the final touches that round out the facial expressions. Creative artists, who need inspiration to do good work, might not be able to fix a specific time, such as a DAY or two, when they will finish an undertaking.

8. Some people tend to be cross

when ROUTED out of bed while half asleep. ROUSED, in this connection, means awakened; the clue "half asleep" indicates that the sleeper is also half awake. ROUTED is stronger, in the sense of compulsion; the sleeper is forced to get up.

11. The LURE of the theater has a permanent fascination for those who are stage-struck. The theater has a compelling attraction, which probably includes the LORE—traditions, etc.—of the stage as well. Equally, however, the stage-struck person would like to appear on the stage or to know theater people, with no interest in its past history.

5. When a roadside stand burned, one might salvage some of the equipment from the GUTTED remains. 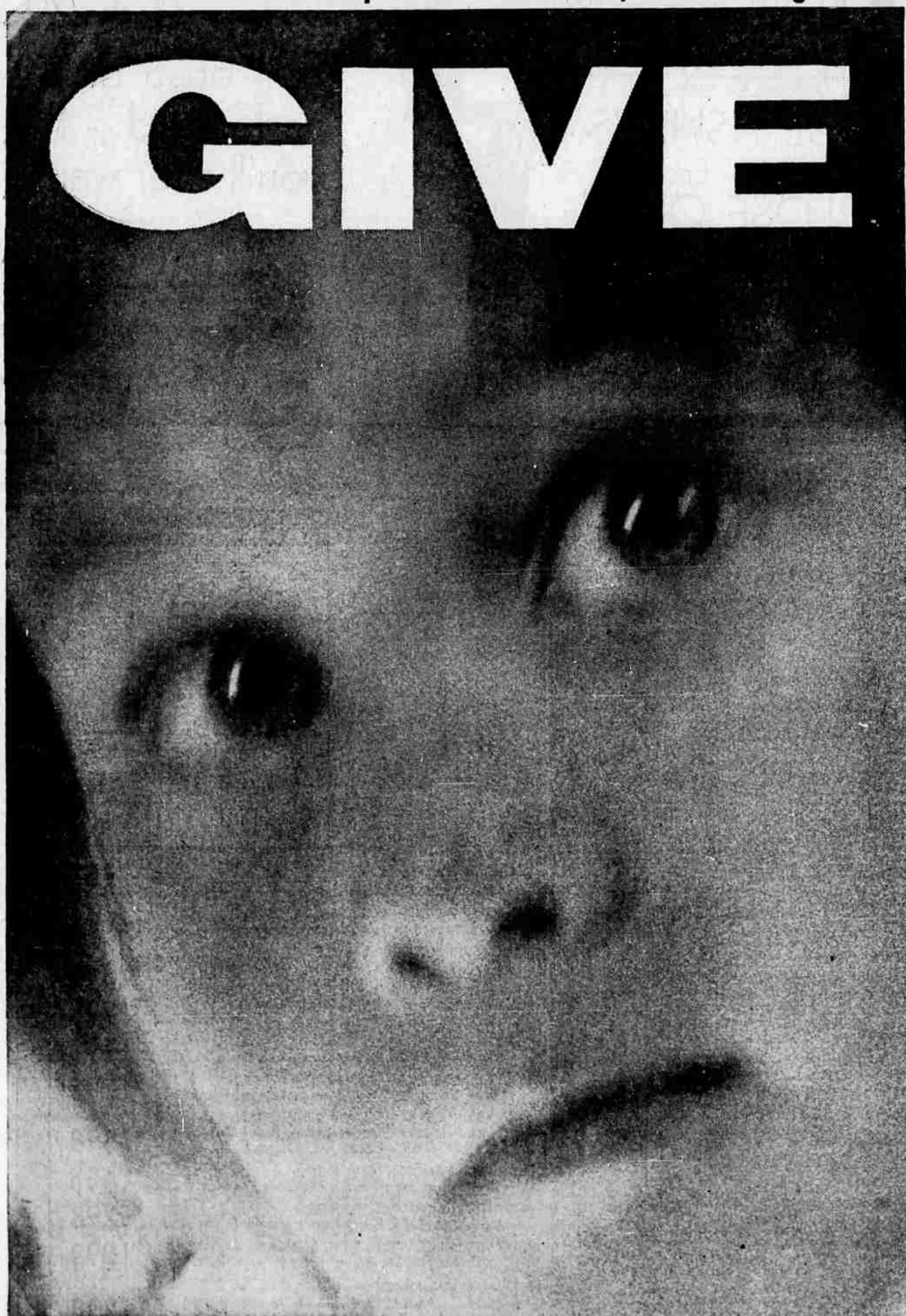
State To Stock 4 Lakes

PORTLAND (AP)—The state Game Commission decided Thursday to clean the fish from four lakes and later restock them with game fish.

The four earmarked for rotenone poisoning this fall were Davis Lake in the Deschutes National Forest, McKay Reservoir near Pendleton, the Empire lakes in Coos County and Rock Creek Res-

Davis, a 3,000-acre lake, has become infested with roach, game agents said. It is to be restocked with rainbow and kokanee, McKay, over-run with bluegills, is to be restocked with trout. Rock Creek and Upper Empire also are to get trout, while Lower Empire gets warm water game fish.

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
