

Oregon Reclamation Projects Win Money

Two Oregon reclamation projects won extra money today in the final compromise agreement in Congress on the public works appropriation bill. And another Oregon river project got planning funds.

The big projects, headed by \$31 million for John Day Lock and Dam and \$12 million for Cougar Reservoir were unchanged.

The appropriation bill went to the White House with these sums appropriated for Oregon:

Army Engineer Projects

Construction: John Day Lock and Dam \$31,000,000; Columbia River mouth, south jetty, \$700,000; Coos Bay, south jetty, \$500,000; Cougar Reservoir, \$12,000,000; Fall Creek Reservoir \$1,000,000; Green Peter Reservoir \$6,000,000; Hills Creek Reservoir \$1,800,000; Lower Columbia River bank protection \$600,000; Rainier Drainage District \$259,000; Beaver Drainage District \$250,000; McNary Lock and Dam \$285,000; Siuslaw River south jetty \$500,000; Umpqua River \$500,000; Willamette River bank protection \$500,000.

Planning: Yaquina Bay and Harbor \$500,000; Tillamook Bay and Harbor, north jetty, \$40,000; Muddy and Marys River, \$25,000; the last one newly added in the final compromise.

Surveys: Chetco River \$10,000; Coquille River \$4,000; Grande Ronde River \$3,000; Port Orford \$8,000; Rogue River \$33,500; Tillamook Bay \$7,800; Umpqua River \$35,400; Willow Creek \$21,100.

Yaquina Bay and Harbor \$155,000; Yaquina River \$75,000; Reclamation Bureau Construction and rehabilitation: Oregon-California, Klamath, \$1,034,000; Rogue River, Talent Division \$1,359,000, a half-million dollar increase in the final compromise; The Dalles, Western Division, \$425,000, a \$75,000 increase; Vale project, Bully Creek extension, \$600,000; Rogue River Basin \$150,000.

Flames Hit Thoma Ranch

MALIN — Flames of undetermined origin, threatened for a time Monday evening to destroy major buildings on the Leonard Thoma ranch two miles west of Malin.

Consumed in the blaze that started about 4:30 p.m. were 60 tons of alfalfa hay, a quantity of baled straw, two frame barns and several hot sheds.

Fire fighting equipment from Merrill, Malin, Tulelake, Suburban and Klamath County answered the call. Direction of the wind kept the flames from the home and other buildings.

Mr. and Mrs. Thoma have lived on the ranch 20 years.

Mrs. Thoma was grinding hay with tractor-operated equipment when the blaze started.

No estimate of loss had been made at press time.

Farmer Swims To Freedom

WITZENHAUSEN, Germany (AP)—A 62-year-old East German farmer and his wife, son and daughter-in-law swam to freedom across a closely guarded Communist border river near here Monday.

West German police reported the four crossed the 100-foot-wide River Werra in full daylight and then asked for asylum in West Germany.

They told police conditions in the collective farm near the border where they had been working had become unbearable.

Community Development Studied By Visitor Here

Helping people to help themselves is the goal of a charming recent visitor from the Philippines who is in America to study community development at the university level.

Mrs. Gertrude (Emilio) Gigunte of Quezon City, P.I. knew exactly the "lay of the land" when she bought her plane ticket for the United States and Klamath Falls.

Mrs. Gigunte has two brothers here, Ariston and Tony Vallejos, who help provide hotel guests with fine food at the Winema and the Willard.

Mrs. Gigunte was a guest in Klamath Falls in 1952, and a houseguest of Mrs. W. D. Miller, when she was just embarking on the educational program promoted by the Bureau of Agricultural Extension, Diliman, Quezon City, and the International Cooperation Administration.

The long range program centers on the training of field workers and assistance in program planning in a comparatively new field in the Philippines. People of her country are most receptive to new ideas and are deeply appreciative of the friendship between America and the Philippines, Mrs. Gigunte says.

Before assuming her new responsibilities, she completed her education at the Women's University, taught in the public schools and was affiliated with the U.S. Public Service, Nutrition Division, traveling widely as a demonstrator.

During this visit to America, she has visited the University of Michigan, University of California at Berkeley, University of Arizona, and before returning home will visit the University of Hawaii and in Japan. While in this country she was present in Washington D.C. for conferences and saw the United Nations.

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Newburgh Manager Threatened

NEWBURGH, N.Y. (UPI)—City Manager Joseph Mitchell said today that he had been threatened by Mayor William B. Ryan and that he had asked for police protection.

Mitchell, author of this city's controversial 13-point welfare code, told United Press International he had asked for the protection following an incident Monday night.

Mitchell said he was "accosted" by Ryan's son, William Jr., after a four-hour city council meeting. He said young Ryan complained that his paycheck had been "short-changed" and that he blamed the city manager for it.

"I told young Ryan that I had nothing to do with the paychecks but he seemed to think that I did," said Mitchell. "He said I'll get you if it takes the rest of my life."

Mayor Ryan was standing there and I looked to him for help," said Mitchell. "Instead he joined in the argument and said 'You're dead. The quicker you get out of town, the better.'"

The mayor did not deny the incident early today.

"If he (Mitchell) thinks I threatened him, he can take it that way," Ryan said. "I told him 'You're dead; but what I meant by that was that his usefulness was finished for this city. If that's a threat, let him accept it as one.'"

"He's running all over the country making speeches. I'm sick and tired of it because he's not doing his job. The sooner we get rid of him, the better," said Ryan.

"This going to work in a police car is just another publicity stunt on his part."

Newburgh has gained nationwide attention in Mitchell's effort to combat rising welfare costs with controversial crackdowns on relief recipients.

Mitchell said he told Police Chief John E. Tierney of Monday night's incident and asked for a police escort to and from work.

Mitchell said he did not plan to press charges against the mayor or his son, who holds a job with the city parking meter department. He said the police chief was investigating the incident.

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
