If you like to roast Rock Cornish game hens in a slow oven, and they're not brown enough, place them under the broiler just before serving.

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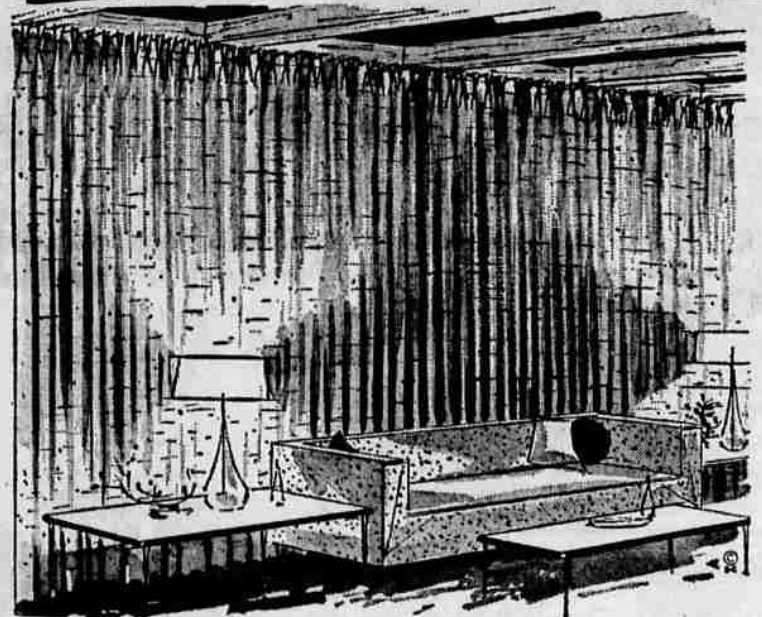
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We The Women
