

Nunn Heads Safe Road Committee

SALEM (AP) — Warne Nunn, chief administrative aid to Gov. Mark Hatfield, was named today to head the Oregon Traffic Safety Commission, replacing Vern L. Hill of the Motor Vehicles Department.

Gov. Mark Hatfield said he named Nunn, a former Motor Vehicles Department director, to the post in a reorganization move that will "result in more direct liaison with and leadership by his office."

The action, Hatfield said, was in line with recommendations of the national traffic safety groups. Hill will remain as vice chairman.

Hatfield said he would name two citizens as non-voting members of the commission in the near future. He also took off the commission the state's public utility commissioner and the director of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission.

A. P. Bunderson, National Safety Council district director, presented to Hatfield one of four national awards for outstanding work in traffic safety.

Bunderson said the awards go to states which exceed by more than 75 per cent minimum national safety standards. He said Oregon ranked third in the nation and first in the West.

Europe Gets Jet Planes

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The United States may send several hundred additional jet fighters to Europe by the end of the year unless the Berlin crisis subsides, Pentagon sources indicate today.

The possibility emerged from guarded responses to reports that all or most of the 18 fighter-equipped Air National Guard squadrons reporting for active duty Monday will be sent overseas.

These squadrons have a total of 411 jet fighters, most of them capable of carrying either conventional or nuclear weapons. Another four squadrons reporting for duty have reconnaissance versions of the planes.

Officials said no decision had been made as to which units would be sent overseas. It also was pointed out that the National Guard squadrons will require 30 to 90 days before they will be ready for duty.

After that they could be sent to Europe or take up stations in the United States to release regular Air Force planes for duty in Europe.

But officials said the guard squadrons would not have been called up unless it had been anticipated that Allied airpower in Europe might have to be increased.

Sending an additional 500 planes to Europe would be a 10 per cent increase in NATO air strength on the continent. A total of approximately 5,000 fighters are now under the NATO command.

Sabotage Law Ups Penalty

NEWPORT, R.I. (AP) — Legislation stiffening the penalties for sabotage of communications systems became law Tuesday with the signature of President Kennedy.

The bill increases to a maximum of 10 years imprisonment and \$10,000 fine the penalties for destruction or damage of commercial companies' facilities that might be used by the government.

The measure grew out of the dynamiting last May of television relay facilities.
