"What is the Human Experience in Creativity" is the theme of the participation session to be conducted by Mary-Averett Seelye of Washington, D.C., at a workshop in Grants Pass at St. Luke's Church, Fourth and D streets, on Friday, Oct. 6.

The workshop is sponsored by the Oregon State Division, American Association of University Women. An interchange of working plans and ideas for all the branches is also on the agenda.

Similar workshops are slated for Corvallis on Oct. 7 and for Pendleton on Oct. 12.

In a two-hour session Mary-Averett Seelye plans to give participants the experience of working with basic performing elements for theater, experiences in creativity as remembering emotions, sharpening the senses, using imagery, and so forth. Every one present must participate in a spirit of exploration. The workshop cannot be conducted if there are any spectators. All ages and all degrees of infirmity can participate. The session can be considered as one way of experiencing something of what goes into any creative act, whatever the art medium.

As coordinator of the Arts Resource Center at the AAUW Headquarters in Washington, D.C., Miss Seelye helps AAUW branches and state divisions develop study programs, studio work, and community projects in the arts, and maintains a wide range of contacts with others working professionally in the arts.
