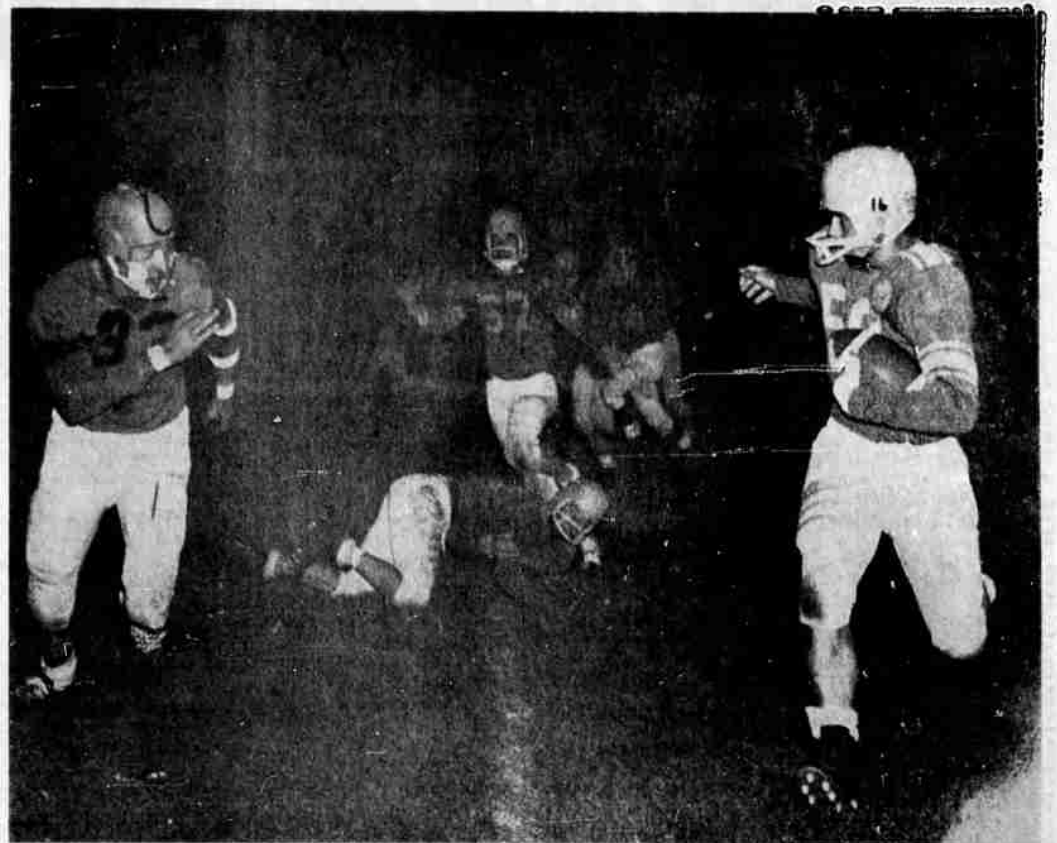


Herald And News Cameraman Catches Some Of Action In Area Games Friday Night

Big Ten To Decide Bowl Play

CHICAGO (UPI)—The Big Ten probably will decide Sunday to try to sign a new contract for annual participation in the Rose Bowl, but the Big Five may be reluctant to enter into a new agreement.

In the past, the Big Ten was the reluctant participant in the agreement, which called for both the Big Ten and the Pacific Coast Conference to furnish a team for the post-season football classic.

But the Big Ten spurned two efforts by the Big Five, the successor of the PCC as the Western Bowl representative, and now that the Big Ten is ready to rejoin, the Big Five may not be.

"We have an open mind," Big Five Commissioner Tom Hamilton said. "We have a policy we like and this does not exclude the Big Ten. They are eligible to come this year on invitation in accordance with our present policy."

The Big Ten-PCC Rose Bowl agreement lasted 14 years and Big Ten teams won 12 of the games, resulting in some West Coast sentiment that the contract should be broken. Last year Minnesota participated in the Bowl as an invited guest, and lost to give the West Coast three wins in 15 years.

TITANS RE-ACQUIRE SCRABIS

Scrabis played college football at Penn State and is a 6-3, 225-pounder.

Medford Wallops South Salem 34-0; Top Ranking Elevens Maintain Their Positions

Nine of the ten top-ranked teams in last week's Associated Press high school football poll saw action Friday night, and all but one of them made the pollsters look good by sweeping their opponents aside with little trouble.

Medford, No. 1 in the poll, trounced South Salem, 34-0, while second-rated Beaverton whipped Milwaukie, 26-7. Milwaukie's lone touchdown marked the first time the Beaverton goal line has been crossed this season.

North Salem, Roseburg and Benson, the next three teams in the poll, scored impressive victories. North Salem took a 26-7 win over Albany. Roseburg walloped Thurston of Springfield, 47-0, and Benson downed Roosevelt 19-0.

But Madison, eight-ranked in the poll, was crushed by unranked Jefferson, 33-14, to spoil the perfect record of the top ten. Jefferson was highly-regarded two weeks ago, but dropped out of the elite group last week after a loss to Benson.

Friday night's loss was Madison's first in Portland Inter-scholastic League play. Klamath Falls, picked for the No. 7 spot by the pollsters, traveled to Eureka, Calif., to gain a 27-14 win, and ninth-rated Corvallis smashed Sweet Home 40-18.

Marshfield, which dropped to tenth last week despite a win over Grants Pass, rolled over South Eugene 33-7 to give notice that it deserves consideration for a higher spot.

Sixth-ranked North Bend plays Coquille tonight. In other Friday night action, David Douglas, last year's A-1 champion, barely edged by Clackamas, 7-6.

Tulelake Honkers Improve

TULELAKE — Tulelake's Honkers swooped down on the Bonanza Antlers at Merrill and came away with a 28-0 victory Thursday night. The Honkers showed great improvement since the previous week's scoreless loss to the Malin Mustangs.

Troy Wooten scored in the first quarter with a four-yard run, with Don Osborne running the extra point. Roy Kreizenbeck made the second touchdown in the third quarter, with Osborne again running the extra point.

In the same quarter Mike Todd ran seven yards for the third touchdown, while Kreizenbeck ran the extra point. Kreizenbeck again scored in the fourth quarter with a seven-yard run. Steve Loisell ran the extra point.

Hank Smith, Tulelake coach, encouraged at the great improvement since the opening game, particularly praised Kreizenbeck and Wooten on the offense.

Ron Kreizenbeck, defensive co-captain, continued to lead the defense, backed by outstanding defensive line play from Orville Barton and Len Daughenbaugh. Second high on defense was Todd in the safety position.

The Honkers ran up a total of 299 yards and passed six times, one being a touchdown called back for a penalty right before half time. Osborne intercepted one pass.

Bonanza had the ball in only 27 plays.

Cross-Country Won By Ashland

Klamath Falls' cross-country racers Friday dropped a dual meet to Ashland, 37-18. The meet was held in Ashland's Lithia Park.

Leading the event were Brown and Way, both of Ashland. Brown posted a mark of 10:14 minutes for the tough 1.8 mile course.

KUHS team coach Paul Deller took 19 boys to the event. Placing in the top 10 were Steve Lawrence, third; Gene McKennie, seventh; Paul Sandoral, eighth, and Dan Michael, 10th.

The Pels will participate in two meets here this week when they host Crater Tuesday, and Grants Pass Friday.

Sacred Heart Whips Pels

Sacred Heart's awesome single wing power exploded again Friday night at Modoc Field as the Trojans won their third straight game of the season, 27-13, over the winless Klamath Jayvees. It was the second time this year that the Trojans have triumphed over the junior Pels.

Mike Holland, who hopes to attend the Air Force Academy after graduation, again resembled a super powered jet as he threw over and flew through the KU defenses.

On the first play from scrimmage Holland went off tackle for a 38-yard trek into pay dirt. Jerry DeNault's run for the conversion gave the academy red shirts a quick 7-0 lead. Moments later the Trojans got the ball following a bad punt on the Jayvees' 19-yard line, and quickly scored again on DeNault's nine-yard run.

Holland hit Keith Murray in the end zone with a pass for the extra point and a 14-0 lead.

Klamath then made its best drive of the game for a score on Bill Bianchi's one-yard plunge. A Rick Horn to John Parisotto pass on the conversion attempt made it 14-7. Horn and Parisotto were to combine for several completions during the night for one of the Pels' few bright spots.

During the Klamath drive the Junior Pelicans were dealt a serious blow when hard-running Roger Rodgers had to leave the game with a sprained ankle. It was Rodgers who ground out most of the yardage on the touchdown trip.

Sacred Heart came back after the half to put the game away. DeNault scored the 20th point on a six-yard plunge. The extra point attempt failed.

Coach Marv DelPlanche's charges scored their final six-pointer on a beautifully executed reverse with Keith Murray ending up with the ball, a 60-yard run, and the touchdown. Doug Murray's run for the conversion made it 27-7.

In the final period Bill Bianchi scored his second touchdown of the night on another plunge from the one-yard line to make the final score 27-13.

Miami Surprises Penn; Southern Cal Wallops SMU

The college football weekend started with a rousing upset Friday night as unranked Miami (Fla.) decisively defeated Penn State, No. 8 in the first week of the Associated Press poll, 25-6.

In other top Friday night games Southern California beat Southern Methodist 21-16, Virginia Military nipped Richmond 8-6 and Detroit defeated Xavier (Ohio) 34-8.

Miami moved 79 yards in 12 plays in the second period for its first touchdown, and scored again in the third on a combination running-passing attack. The Hurricanes added another touchdown and a field goal by Charley Livingston in the final period.

Southern California's Willie Brown, a 175-pound soph half-back, got loose for a 93-yard TD run in the first quarter to put the Trojans ahead. Then, after SMU had tied the score at 7-7, he scampered 18 and 30 yards, respectively, to set up the Trojans' second and third touchdowns.
