Ducks Prepare For Tilt With Gophers Saturday

EUGENE (AP) — The Oregon football team, rocked by a 14-6 weekend loss to Utah, began practice today for its game against Minnesota at Minneapolis next Saturday.

Minnesota, which lost 17-7 to Washington in the Rose Bowl last New Year's, held strong Missouri to a 6-0 win over the weekend.

Oregon, at Salt Lake City, held a slight statistical advantage, 231 to 176 yards gained and 12 first downs to 11, but five Utah pass interceptions spelled the difference.

Oregon scored early in the game after recovering a fumble on the Utah 25-yard line. Six plays later quarterback Doug Post sneaked across from the one. Buck Carey missed the conversion.

The Ducks nearly scored again in the second period. But Utah intercepted a Post pass in its end zone and promptly launched an 80-yard touchdown drive. Bud Tynes plunged the final two yards and Utah went ahead on the first of two conversions by Dennis McLaughlin.

The Redskins then beat off all Oregon threats and in the fourth period marched 51 yards to an insurance touchdown. Again it was Tynes scoring, this time from one yard out.

Mel Renfro, Oregon's prize sophomore speedster, suffered a leg injury in the first period. He returned in the second for one play, then retired for the afternoon.

Len Casanova, Oregon head coach, had high praise for Utah. "It was the best Utah team we've ever faced," he said. "You can't take anything away from them. They were aggressive and played fine defense."

On the other hand he was deeply disappointed with his team.

"We were inconsistent, slow and hesitant in our blocking," he said. "We would do some good things, then some stupid ones. Part of it can be charged to inexperience, I guess."

Casanova said Renfro's early injury hurt Oregon's offense. He said it appears Renfro suffered either a pulled ligament or a chipped bone near the ankle and "it doesn't look good." He ordered X-rays taken today.

CORVALLIS (AP) — Coach Tommy Prothro said Sunday there will be "lots of changes" in the Oregon State football lineup when the team meets Idaho

in Corvallis next weekend.

The Beavers fell apart in the second half and Stanford scored five touchdowns for a 34-0 victory Saturday.

"They got ahead and we quit," Prothro said. "This is the first I've ever had that quit."

He had praise only for a reserve fullback, Bruce Williams, who gained 32 yards in the three times he carried the ball.

The Beavers had two fine scoring opportunities in the first half.

After taking the opening kickoff they marched 88 yards to the Stanford 3-yard line. But there

quarterback Terry Baker, whose 25-yard pass to Roger Johnson had sparked the drive, fumbled and Stanford recovered.

Near the end of the half they again reached the Stanford 3 after a 31-yard scamper by Baker.

With time running out Tim Ankersen failed on a field goal attempt.

Oregon State again proved vulnerable to passes. Stanford's tossers completed 11 of 18 for 160 yards.

Baker and OSU halfback Don Kasso were the game's leading rushers. Kasso had a net yardage total of 61 on eight carries. Baker had a net of 47 in six tries.

Baker completed only 7 of 20 passes for 92 yards.

Hickey Coaches 49ers To NFL Lead; Chargers Lone Undeateated Team In AFL

Destroy Detroit Defense

An unprecedented juggling act and the efficiency of the unorthodox shotgun offense have established the San Francisco 49ers as legitimate pretenders to the Western Conference throne.

The 49ers emphasized their title claims by demolishing Detroit's vaunted defense in a 49-0 triumph Sunday that spilled the Lions from the undefeated class and created a four-way tie for the lead in the western division. It was the first time in 115 games the Lions were unable to score.

The 49ers did it with coach Red Hickey calling all the plays for the first time since he took over three years ago and alternating John Brodie, Bill Kilmer and Bobby Waters with devastating effectiveness on almost every play.

Elsewhere, it was an equally bad day for unbeaten teams as the league champion Philadelphia Eagles were beaten by the St. Louis Cardinals 30-27 and the Dallas Cowboys were whipped by the Cleveland Browns 25-7.

In other games, Green Bay's defending western titleists defeated Chicago 24-0, Baltimore edged Minnesota 34-33, New York defeated Washington 24-21 and Los Angeles beat Pittsburgh 24-14.

Gerry Perry's 27-yard field goal with five seconds remaining gave the Cards (2-1) a come-from-behind victory over the Eagles (2-1).

The Browns (2-1) used a 7-yard touchdown bolt by Jimmy Brown, two field goals by Lou Groza and two scoring pitches from Milt Plum to Rich Drahtling to build up a commanding 25-0 lead.

Bart Starr passed 18 yards to Boyd Dowler and 17 to Ron Kramer for touchdowns while Jim Taylor and Paul Hornung picked up valuable yardage on the ground for the Packers (2-1).

Steve Myhra booted a 52-yard field goal on the final play as the Colts (2-1) edged the Vikings (1-2). Lenny Moore scored four TDs for Baltimore, one on a 72-yard pass from Johnny Unitas.

Y. A. Tittle pulled the Giants (2-1) ahead with a touchdown with 11 minutes remaining, scoring on a one-yard plunge that spoiled Washington's debut in a new stadium.

Ollie Matson and quarterback Frank Ryan collaborated on a 95-yard pass play that sent the Rams (1-2) in front to stay against the Steelers (0-3).

Hawkeyes, Rebels Retain Top Rank; Schedules Tough

It will be another month yet before Iowa and Mississippi realize their moment of truth in college football, unless—

Unless the roof falls in on them as it did to Ohio State, Rice, Penn State and UCLA, to name four, last weekend.

The two powerhouses, ranked 1-2 nationally in The Associated Press' poll, may make it unscathed until Nov. 4, when both face their toughest opponents of the year, Ohio State and Louisiana State, respectively.

The Hawkeyes, who made Coach Jerry Burns debut a success Saturday by beating California 28-7, play Southern California this weekend.

Mississippi, with two straight victories, and 17 games in an unbeaten string, takes on Florida State, Ole Miss had to work for a 20-7 victory over Kentucky Saturday night.

Between Southern Cal and Ohio

State, Iowa faces Big Ten foes Indiana, Wisconsin and Purdue while Ole Miss must tackle Houston, Tulane and Vanderbilt before playing LSU.

Ohio State, though, had its thoughts of a perfect season jolted by upset-maker Texas Christian, which held the favored Buckeyes to a 7-7 tie. Last week, TCU upset Kansas 17-16, and now challenges Texas for Southwest Conference supremacy. Those two don't meet till late in November.

Rice, another of the so-called SWC elite, ran right into Georgia Tech's up-and-coming buzzsaw that moved 'em down 24-0 while UCLA, the pride of the West Coast's Big Five, got ambushed by Michigan 28-6.

Coupled with Penn State's Friday night loss, the nation's top ten teams are in a rather bedraggled condition.

However, Saturday is another game and Ohio State gets a chance to catch the Uclans still down. Penn State takes on Boston University, a 31-7 loser to Rice Saturday, on Friday night. Rice is idle.

Some of the big boys made out better. Alabama, which now contends with Ole Miss and Georgia Tech for Southeastern Conference honors, beat Tulane 9-0 and plays Vanderbilt this week. Fifth-ranked Syracuse scored 29-14 over West Virginia, which hasn't won a game in 18 starts, and will have a little more competition this week from Maryland.

Texas continued going strong, walloping Texas Tech 42-14 and meets Washington State on Saturday. Michigan State (No. 10), atop the Big Ten after beating Wisconsin 29-0, will find out if Stanford is for real. The Indians, after an all-losing season in 1960, won their second Saturday, upending Oregon State 34-0.

Notre Dame convinced everyone it wasn't kidding with its 19-6 beating of Oklahoma and Navy may not be as dead as many think after beating William & Mary 44-6.

Bob Garner intercepted one by George Herring on the Denver 10 which made the first Oakland score possible. And in the second period, Fred Williamson rammed 26 yards after a theft of a pass by Frank Tripucka to put the ball on the Denver 26. On the next play, Flores fired one to Bob Coolebaugh for a TD.

Fleming's 54-yard field goal came with 1:41 left in the first half and was the only one he got in three tries. Others fizzled from 42 and 47 yards away.

"The defense deserves most of the credit for this win," coach Marty Feldman said afterward. "Those two goal line stands showed that the defensive unit really wants to play."

The Raiders draw a bye next Sunday, then face Denver in a re-match at the Broncos' stadium Oct. 15.

Titans Lead In Eastern

San Diego's Chargers and New York's Titans hold clear-cut leads over the respective divisions of the American Football League because the Chargers are versatile and the Titans have Al Dorow.

San Diego continued as the only undefeated team in the league last weekend but had to rely on defense and kicking to beat stubborn Buffalo 19-11. The decision left the Charger at the top of the Western Division with a 4-0 record.

New York moved into the undisputed lead in the Eastern Division with a 37-30 heart-lugger over Boston. When the chips were down the 29-year-old Dorow stepped in to toss a pass that broke a 30-30 tie. The Titans' record is 3-1.

Dallas strengthened its second place position in the Western Division when it beat Houston 26-21 and showed how valuable Abner Haynes can be.

Haynes had been on the ailing list while Dallas slumped, taking a licking from San Diego and being pressed to the limit by down-trodden Oakland. But he returned to full-time duty Sunday and led Dallas to victory. Dallas, with Jack Spikes running for 144 yards and Haynes for 117, set a league one-game rushing record of 398 yards.

Oakland won its first league game Sunday when it whipped Denver 33-19. Oakland had lost two and had 99 points scored against it before snapping out of the doldrums. George Fleming kicked a 54-yard field goal for Oakland, a new league record.

Oakland and New York are idle next weekend. San Diego will be at Boston Saturday night. In Sunday games, Dallas goes to Denver and Buffalo to Houston.

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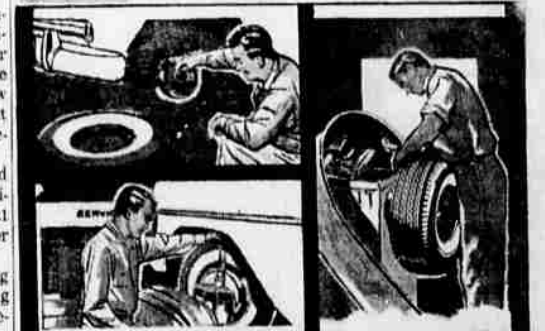
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
