Police Probe To Continue In Denver

DENVER (AP) — A state-city investigation of the biggest police crime scandal in the nation's history continued today amid indications more arrests will follow those of 35 present or former Denver officers already apprehended or being sought.

Gov. Steve McNichols disclosed charges against officers or former officers and one civilian Saturday and suggested a link with syndicated crime.

The magnitude of the police criminal roundup — McNichols himself termed it an "incredible criminal incest" — dwarfed police corruption disclosures in Chicago and Kansas City in recent years.

Denver Dist. Atty. Bert M. Keating and other officials made plain they expect still more arrests to follow. Keating said he expects four or five more officers to be charged and about the same number to be forced to resign.

The crimes outlined by McNichols at a special press conference range from burglary to prostitution. In earlier arrests of patrolmen, only burglary, theft and receiving stolen goods had been mentioned.

McNichols' references to prostitution and gambling suggested that the police criminals may have been allied with a giant crime syndicate. Atty. Gen. Duke W. Dunbar refused to elaborate on the possibility. He termed the governor's remarks "a preliminary disclosure."
