Crippled Ship Goes 2850 MPH

EDWARDS AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AP)—Rocketing into dangers future spacemen must conquer when they return to earth, an X15 pilot streaked 2,850 miles an hour today with his tiny ship deliberately crippled.

Missing, for the first time, was the rocket plane's big bottom fin—an important aid in maintaining stability at high altitudes where the air is thin.

Engineers had figured the X15 would be easier to handle in such an emergency if the big ventral fin were jettisoned.

Air Force Maj. Robert Rushworth kept the engine at half throttle for the glide home after reaching a top altitude of 79,000 feet.
