

Major Stars Placed On 'Premium' List

CINCINNATI (AP) — Billy O'Dell, Daryl Spencer, Dick Farrell, Don Blasingame and Hal Smith are among the 16 "premium" players at \$125,000 each on the special lists from which the Houston and New York clubs will pick their players. The Associated Press learned Saturday.

Each of the two new clubs in the expanded National League will be permitted to take four from this special list after they have picked 24 from the regular lists made public by the AP last week.

The regular lists, containing players considered of lesser quality, are sealed from \$75,000 down to \$50,000 for each player.

The actual premium lists have not been officially presented to the new clubs and will not be until the day after the World Series. Both General Manager Paul Richards of Houston and President George Weiss of New York are aware of the players' identity.

National League President Warren Giles, disturbed by open criticism of the quality of players expressed by Richards, presided at a special meeting of general managers Friday at which both Richards and Weiss were present.

"I explained to New York and Houston that in addition to the regular draft lists, there still are 16 special or premium players to be selected from," said Giles.

"The eight existing clubs said the lists were the best they could give," Giles continued.

Richards, who earlier had blasted the list as inadequate, accepted this explanation and said, "Under the circumstances, I have no comment. I have said a lot already. I'm holding off until later on."

Weiss, former general manager of the New York Yankees, said "of course, you're never satisfied. But I am not condemning the list. There is no sense screaming and hollering. I don't want to condemn it (lists) until we know all that is coming."

CINCINNATI (UP)—Local fans call it "the terrace." Yogi Berra calls it "murder." And the amused Cincinnati Reds call it the piece of real estate that could easily decide the World Series.

The particular section in question is a hilly slope that rolls down from the left field fence at Crosley Field where the already anguished Berra will have to spend most of the next three days.

"Wow, never saw nuthin' like it before," muttered Yogi after fangling with the tricky infield for the first time during Friday's off-day workout.

Extends Around Outfield
"That hill out there is bad enough," he went on, "but then you got the sun and that ledge along the left field wall to take care of, too."

The incline extends all around the entire outfield. It is steepest in the left field sector where it slopes up almost four feet from the level of the rest of the ball park.

"There's no set formula for playing that slope," said Darrell Johnson of the Reds. "I've seen several guys almost fall on their faces trying to chase a ball up there."

Miss AMERICA BOWLS

Don't be in too much of a hurry to start rolling.

This is one of the first things professional bowlers tell you. Get set properly before you get set. That's the reason for stressing the importance of the stance.

The word stance is defined as "mode of standing, or being placed." In other words, getting the feet and arms in position. In bowling, it's how you stand and the position of the arms before you begin the approach.

A good stance is natural and comfortable. Usually one stands with the knees bent slightly, feet close together with one foot a little ahead of the other. Tall bowlers often will bend slightly at the waist. Shorter bowlers are inclined to stand more erect.

The weight of the ball should rest on the non-bowling hand while in the stance position. Elbows should be close to sides. Don't mistake stance for stance.

Pact Assures Mets Park

NEW YORK (UPI)—The new National League baseball entry in New York is still without any players but it is guaranteed of soon having a ball park.

The official signatures of M. Donald Grant, chairman of the board of the New York Mets, and city parks Commissioner Newbold Morris were placed on the appropriate lines Friday to grant

the new club a 30-year lease to use the soon-to-be-constructed Municipal Stadium.

However, the \$19 million stadium will not be ready in time for the Mets to use it when they make their major league debut next season. Instead they will use the Polo Grounds, home of the former New York Giants.

Construction of the stadium which will be built in Flushing Meadow Park should be finished by next fall, though, and ready for occupancy by the New York Titans of the American Football League. The Titans are expected to sign a 20-year lease for the stadium within the next two weeks.
