Passing a peanut from one spoon to another may sound easy. Try it and see.

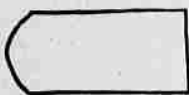

No fair using hands. If the nut is dropped, it must be picked up with the spoon only.

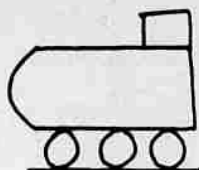
The peanut should make the round trip—down the line and back to the starting player. The team to finish first wins.

Let's Draw an Old Engine

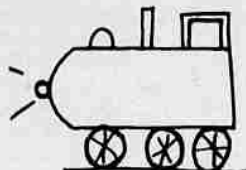

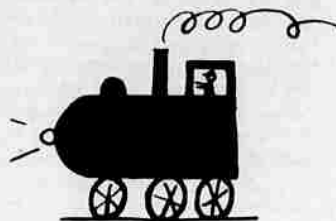
Draw a box and round
