CORVALLIS (AP) — Oregon State University has 9,026 students, an increase of 1,127 from a year ago. It is an all-time record enrollment.

Registration ended at noon Saturday and showed the greatest one-year jump in the school's history aside from the 1945-46 comparison when the end-of-the-war rush started. In 1945 the enrollment was 3,126. In 1946 it was 7,133.

The new student body includes 2,500 freshmen, an increase of 21 per cent from last year.

The big increase can be handled adequately, officials said. Five new dormitories have been built in the past five years. Another increase is looked for a year from now—and another dormitory now under construction—will be ready then.

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
