Medicare Plan Takes Final Form

SALEM (AP) — The medical care package for low-income elderly took its final form today and the state Welfare Commission will begin accepting applications for the aid Oct. 16.

Andrew Juras, acting state welfare administrator, said the \$11.5 million program, financed by the federal, state and county governments, will go into effect for this biennium Nov. 1.

He said it will provide aid to an estimated 5,000 persons in low-income brackets but not on welfare. There will be an average limit of \$9 per month for each person.

The commission staff, in line with a resolution adopted by the commission, set the fees doctors can charge at 90 per cent of the printed schedule of fees for medical services to welfare recipients.

The 10 per cent saved by reducing these fees was added to hospital benefits, cutting down the hospital deductible from \$100 to \$75.

This means that the plan will provide 14 days of hospitalization but the patient must assume \$7.50 per day of the cost for the first 10 days. This same provision applies to emergency or out patient treatment where the patient does not actually enter the hospital.

The plan will provide \$150 per year for medical visits and treatments, \$100 per year for X-ray and laboratory work and \$500 per year for surgery. All of these are less \$50 deductible collectively.

This means that within the average \$9 per month per person limit that \$4.05 is planned for doctor care, 16 cents is planned for outpatient and nursing home care and \$4.79 is planned for the hospitalization portion.

Under the plan, however, a person can go from a hospital to a nursing home and get four days of nursing home care per month for each remaining day of hospitalization under the plan. To be eligible for this nursing home care, however, the person must go from a hospital and not go directly into a nursing home.

Juras said that to qualify a person must be an Oregon resident and at least 65 years old. The person's annual income cannot exceed \$1,500 or, in the case of a married couple, \$2,000. The person also cannot own real property, excluding a home, with a market value of more than \$500.

Juras urged eligible persons to sign up as soon as possible even though they may not need any medical care immediately. He said this way, if a person becomes sick, the deductible provisions go into effect and the actual aid becomes available sooner.

Each of the 36 county public welfare offices, Juras said, can accept applications. The plan is financed 52 per cent by the federal government. The rest of the cost is paid 70 per cent by the state and 30 per cent by the counties.

Dean Bryson Named Judge

SALEM (AP)—Gov. Mark Hatfield named Dean Bryson, 51, Portland lawyer, a Multnomah County circuit judge and also appointed new members to the state Welfare Commission and the state Board of Health.

Bryson, immediate past president of the Oregon State Bar and a former Republican legislator, was named to the judgeship left vacant by the death last week of Judge Frank Loneragan.

Hatfield named Ray C. Cates, Salem insurance man, to the state Welfare Commission, succeeding Joseph E. Harvey Jr., Portland, president of Oregon Physicians Service, who resigned.

Cates is a member of the Salem School Board and former Oregon moderator for the Conservative Baptist Association.

Dr. John G. P. Cleland, Oregon City, was named to the state Board of Health, succeeding Dr. Brandt Bertels, Medford, who resigned.

Cates takes over the Welfare Commission spot left by the resignation of Harvey, who was chairman. Harvey resigned when OPS, a doctor-operated medical insurance plan, submitted a proposal to run Oregon's medical care program for elderly needy. The proposal was rejected by the commission.
