Night Meet Talks Pact

DETROIT (AP) — The United Auto Workers' International Executive Board meets tonight with a double mission—to review the Ford Motor Co. negotiations and to consider what to do about the American Motors Corp. contract. Top-level Ford and UAW negotiators were to resume sessions today on the last two national non-economic issues standing in the way of ending the nine-day-old strike of 120,000 hourly paid Ford workers.

Walter P. Reuther, UAW president, said there is a possibility of an all-night session tonight. The union is driving to get a new contract in time to present it to a scheduled meeting of its Ford Council Thursday afternoon.

The two remaining non-economic national problems at Ford are production standards and a union demand for more company-paid union representatives to handle plant grievances.

YELLOW CAB FOUNDER DIES
LOS ANGELES (UPI) — John Daniel Hertz, 82, founder of the Yellow Cab Taxi and Hertz Car Rental System, will be buried privately in Chicago, his family said today.

Hertz, who retired in 1955 as chairman of the Hertz Corp. board, died Sunday night.

United Fund Education Division Reaches Goal

Education Division of the 1962 Klamath County United Fund drive went over its goal at Monday's report luncheon, adding \$358 from the city schools to top the division's goal of \$8,091. It became the first entire division to reach 100 per cent in the current drive.

United Fund stands at 62.2 per cent of its total fund-raising effort of \$135,309 with only one week left in the campaign.

Education Division is chairmaned by Paul Meier. Unit chairmen were Harold Ashley, city schools, and Ray Garrison, county schools. Meier also is unit chairman for Oregon Technical Institute.

OTI led the fund-raising field in the division with 120.3 per cent of its quota of \$2,628. City schools, still incomplete, raised \$2,791 or 76.5 per cent of the \$3,450 quota. County schools, also incomplete,

are at 57.6 per cent of their \$3,059 quota with a total report of \$2,682.

Meier said that since the division was not complete as yet, they will continue their solicitation until each member of the respective school systems has had a chance to share in this victory. Meier challenged other divisions to equal or surpass their accomplishment.

Other divisions, listed in order of their percentage standings as of Monday noon: Chippewas, 74.8 per cent; Chapter Plan, 72.8 per cent; Apaches, 65.16 per cent; Special Gifts, 61 per cent; Modocs, 57.9 per cent; Professional, 53.3 per cent; Cheyennes, 51.5 per cent; Mohawks, 46.7 per cent; Navajoes, 42.8 per cent; Winemas, 36.3 per cent; Winnemuccas, 19.1 per cent; Crows, 15.2 per cent and Public Employees, 12.8 per cent.
