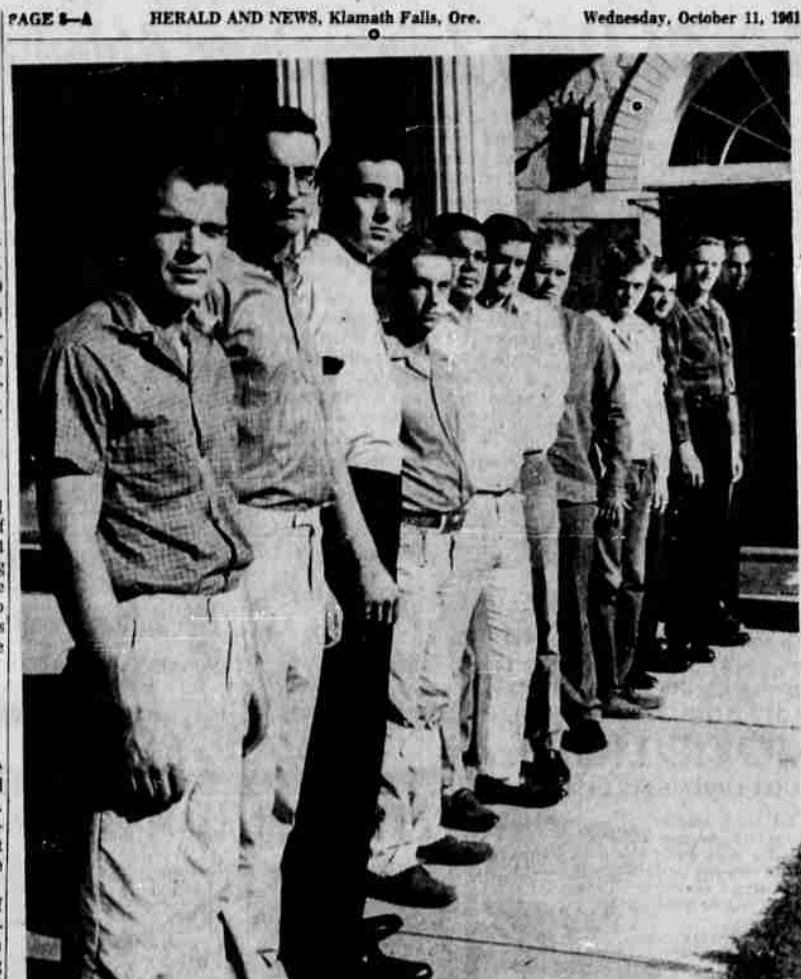


# Local Men In Training For Duty In Services

## Pay Workers Reach High

**WASHINGTON (AP)** — Employment of wage and salary workers in the United States reached 53,900,000 in September, the highest figure for any month, the Labor Department said today.

Total employment, which includes the self-employed and others, however, dropped 1.5 million from August, to about 67 million. The Labor Department said the drop was due mainly to the return to school of young workers who left summer jobs.

Unemployment dropped 450,000 to 4.1 million, but the Labor Department said the decline was mostly seasonal.

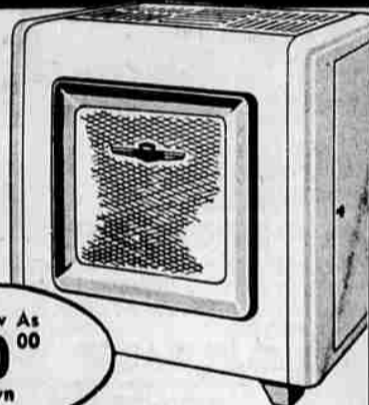

# Bids Asked To Build Chemult Ranger Station

The United States Forest Service is calling for bids to be opened Oct. 20 and Oct. 27 for construction of a new ranger station at Chemult, according to Alex Smith, forest supervisor. Bid forms and specifications have been distributed to all known interested bidders. Plans for development of the Chemult site call for construction of a ranger's office, five residences, two 10-man barracks, a warehouse and gas and oil storage. Bids for building construction will be opened Oct. 27 at 2 p.m. in the office of the Regional Forester, Portland, Ore. Bid invitations are also out for construction of a water tank, pumping system and the facilitating improvements necessary in connection with the domestic water supply. The water system bids will be opened Oct. 20, also in Portland.

The Chemult ranger station site lies on the north outskirts of Chemult adjacent to Highway 97. All building sites have been cleared and driveways and courtyards graded. Under a previous contract, a well has been drilled on the site.

Plans and specifications for these improvements are available at the office of the Forest Supervisor, 411 Main Street, Klamath Falls, or the Regional Forester, Post Office Box 4137, Portland 8, Ore.
