'Watchdogs' Clear Duke Blue Devils

NEW YORK (UPI) — The Duke University football team was cleared by the National Collegiate Athletic Association today of reports that one of its players was under surveillance in gridiron point shaving comparable to the basketball "fixes."

Revealing that the NCAA has two watchdogs "inside gambling" to "keep us abreast of such de-

velopments," executive director Walter Byers said his organization had no reports concerning Duke or any investigation under way regarding the Blue Devils. He admitted categorically, however, that unspecified cases had "been reported already to the appropriate officials" and refused comment on whether any investigations currently were being conducted.

"It is against our policy to comment on investigations which may or may not be under way," Byers explained. "I can neither confirm nor deny whether we are making any investigations." Byers thus left it completely wide open to speculation that some players or teams were being watched or investigated. But in connection with Duke, which two separate and reliable

sources had hinted were under surveillance, Byers asserted "we have no evidence to indicate that there is any credence to the report."

"We earnestly request that you forward to us any evidence you have that would support it or any comparable rumor," Byers said. Byers also admitted that the NCAA has "very limited means" in the "area of gambling investigation."

"It is different in such matters as recruiting," he pointed out. "If your school is after a boy and I get him, usually I know whether you beat the rules and I can inform the NCAA. But we simply don't get such concrete information in connection with gambling."

The NCAA, he admitted, has "limited resources" when it comes to the investigation of gambling and "doesn't have the primary sources of information."

"The federal government has great resources along these lines and it is something which, with its new laws, it is better equipped to handle," he acknowledged.

Byers admitted a reluctance to discuss the report against Duke "because it opens other avenues of inquiry on which it is our policy to make no statement."

One of the reasons, it is deduced, is that the NCAA has no police powers in such matters. "The NCAA makes an earnest effort to keep informed concerning developments in the field of organized gambling," he conceded, "and if meaningful information comes to our attention we promptly inform the appropriate collegiate and law enforcement officials. In addition to the NCAA's efforts, many of our allied conferences have similar alert systems."

"Concerning your general inquiry regarding other gambling reports," he added, "there is nothing in our files which has not been reported already to the appropriate officials and subjected to thorough investigation."

Hinting that, while no information has been lodged against Duke, there are other "fix" cases in the wind in college football which are under investigation.

Texans Set To Beat Sooners; Michigan In Big 10 'Crucial'

Texas, which never could win the "big one" against Oklahoma teams laden with Texans, has a talented group of stay-at-homes, ready to make the winless Sooners its fourth straight victim this week.

The fourth-ranked Longhorns, coached by Darrell Royal who toiled so spectacularly for Oklahoma Coach Bud Wilkinson a few years back, have their most powerful team in years and plan on letting the Sooners know about it.

Royal has three straight victories over his former mentor. Texas is ranked first nationally in total offense, second in rushing of offense, third in scoring and seventh in rushing defense.

Besides Royal, a "foreigner" from Hollis, Okla., the Longhorns have quarterback Mike Cotten from Austin, halfbacks Jimmy Saxton, from Palestine, and Jack Collins from Dallas, and fullback Ray Poage from Houston.

Oklahoma's halfback Mike McGeehan is a Texan from Stamford, while standout end Ronnie Payne is from Breckenridge.

January Date Set For Bout

BOSTON (UPI) — The third meeting between European middleweight champion Terry Downes of London and Paul Pender of Brookline is scheduled for Boston Garden next Jan. 20, the promoter announced late Wednesday.

Downes, who won the partial title from Pender last July in London, was forced to postpone a scheduled Sept. 23 rematch when he suffered a hand injury in an accident in his home. Promoter Sam Silverman said the injury was healing properly following surgery.

Pender, a former fireman, scored a seven round TKO over Downes in their first meeting here last Jan. 14. In their London rematch, Pender did not answer the ninth round bell after Downes had taken six of the first eight rounds.
