Woman Hides In Trunk

SEATTLE (AP) — An Alaska woman, her hand waving feebly through a hole punched through the back seat of an automobile, was found Friday locked in the car trunk on a ship that had been at sea six days.

The woman, identified as Francisca Mario, about 40, apparently had been in the car trunk since the steamship Tosina left Cordova, Alaska. She was taken to a hospital for treatment of stiffness and exposure.

Raymond J. Wingsness, Alaska Steamship Co. purser, discovered the woman in the car when the Tosina docked here.

Alaska Steam said the car was put aboard by Amos Uganiza, 53, a fisherman who flew here ahead of the steamship. Uganiza said the woman apparently took it upon herself to follow him to Seattle.

Police said they found some food in the trunk and the woman may have obtained a little water from moisture condensation.
