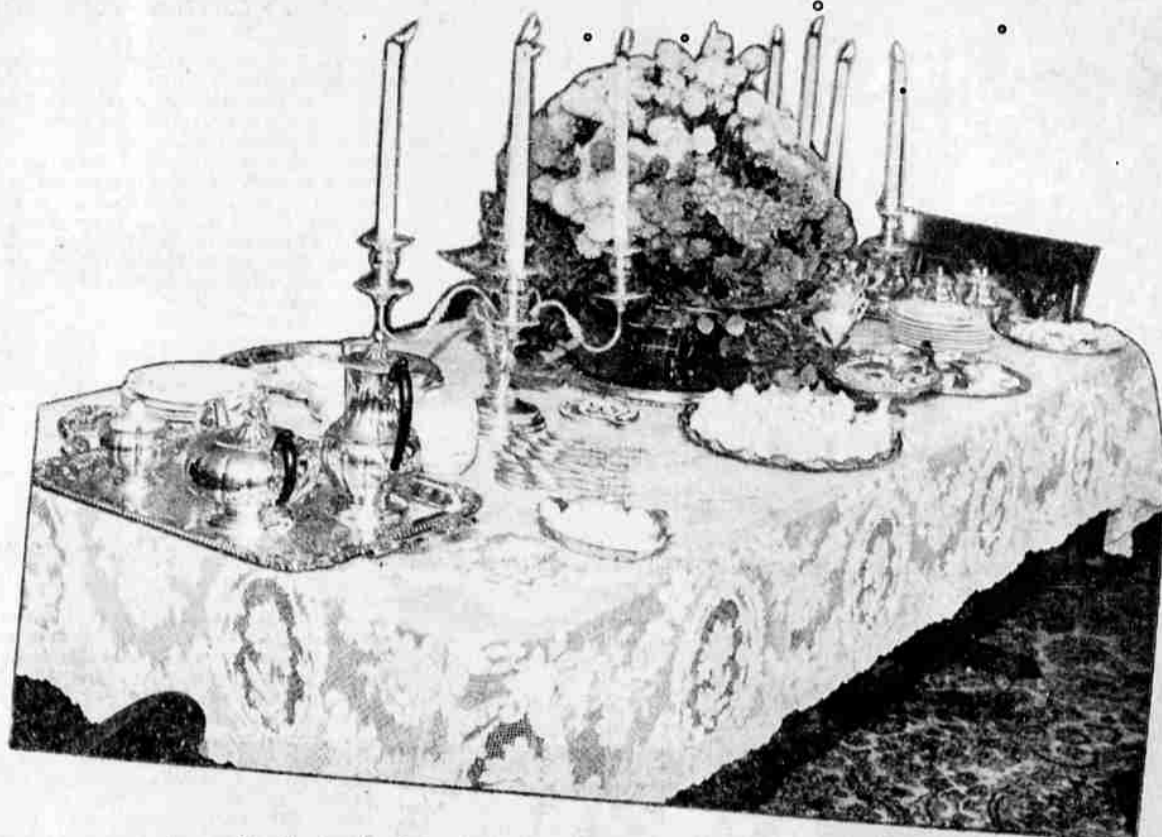


Episcopal All-Parish Tea One Of Season's Loveliest Affairs
