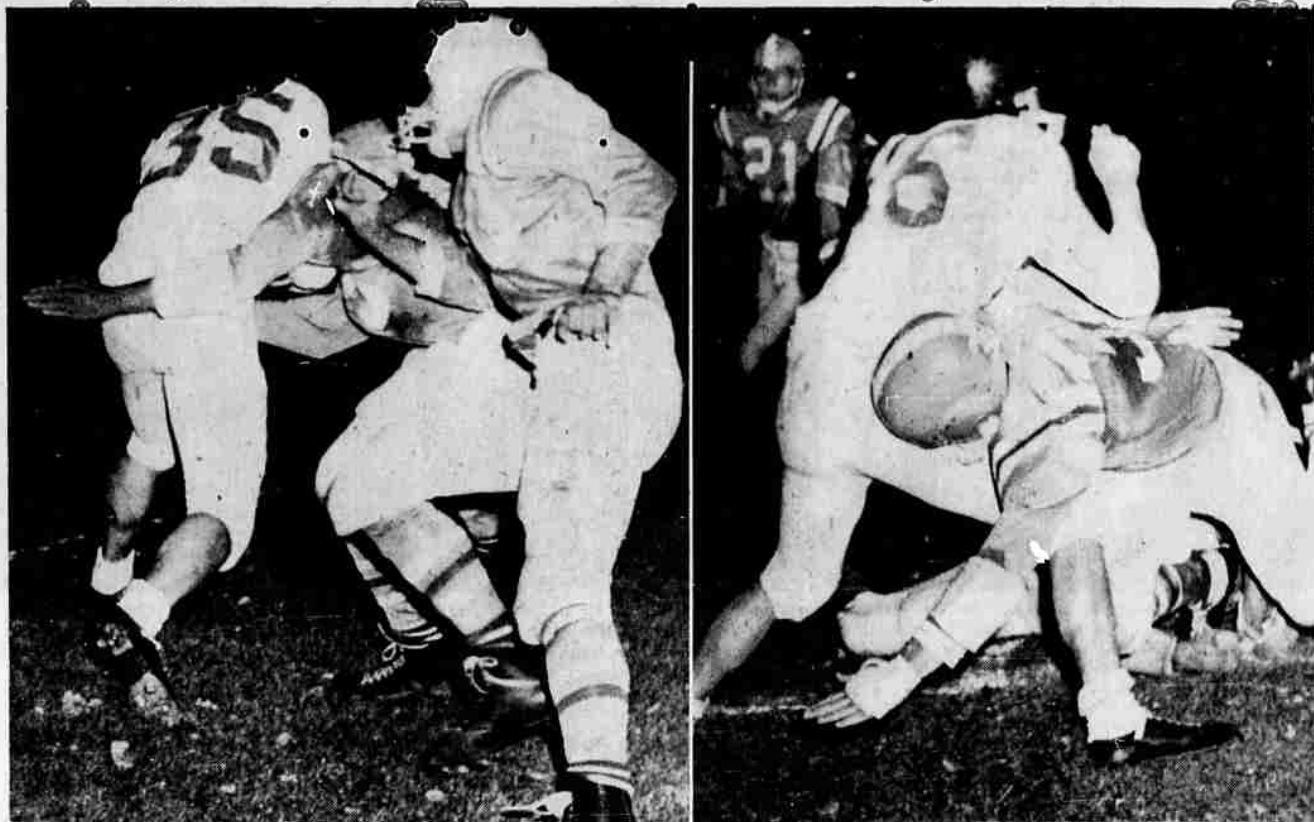

 The oldie that "winning isn't everything—it is the only thing" seems to be working in the American Football League for San Diego and K.S. (Bud) Adams, owner of the two frequently losing Houston Oilers.

San Diego just goes out and wins them all so there'll be no doubt it.

Adams demands that his team win or else there's a new coach—a tie won't get the job done.

Not even if it's a 31-31 tie that turns into about the wildest, most thrilling offensive struggle of the year.

Adams reportedly told his coach, Lou Rymkus, that he had to beat Boston last Friday night or he was through. Hence the firing of Rymkus since there was only a tie.

Another coach, Frank Filchock of Denver, may have escaped the axe when Jack Hill kicked two field goals in the final three minutes, the last with eight seconds to go, and the Broncos beat Oakland 27-24. Filchock reportedly had been in the same situation as Rymkus.

Oakland's coach had nothing to worry about, although the team has won only one game. Coach Eddie Erdelatz already has been fired, and the new coach hardly will be relieved since he can't do much worse.

Dallas had a couple of good ones while losing to Buffalo 27-24 Sunday. It was enough for the Texans to fight about—losing to the likes of Buffalo when a victory could have put Dallas back solidly in the race.

Anyway, twice in the last minutes the benches emptied at Buffalo, and once the linemen just stood across from each other and tried to see how hard and whom they could hit.

The loss was a crippling blow to Dallas' hopes. It dropped the Texans 2½ games behind San Diego in the Western Division race.

San Diego rolled merrily onward with a 25-10 victory over New York. It was San Diego's sixth straight and was achieved like most of the others—on the passing of Jack Kemp and the running of Paul Lowe.

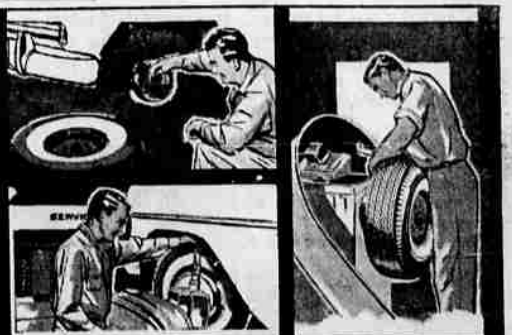

Rose Bowl Prospect One Merry Mixup

 Just one Big Five Conference game has been played, yet California's shocking surprise victory over the Washington Huskies shows there could be a merry mix-up for Rose Bowl selectors when the campaign is over.

This week's slate should give a clearer indication whether there will be a clear cut champion as host in the Pasadena football classic, yet again the race could go down to the wire.

California, after beating the favored defending champion Huskies 21-14, hosts the unpredictable Southern California Trojans who fell before Notre Dame 30-0. Stanford, with a 3-1 mark, travels to Seattle to face a revenge-minded Washington club.

UCLA's game with independent Pittsburgh at Los Angeles will give a further indication since Washington victimized the Panthers two Saturdays ago.

Final selection of the Rose Bowl team rests with the five conference members voting after the season ends. A two or three-way deadlock would complicate their problem.

In this week's other action, San Jose State plays at Oregon, Washington State at Indiana, Idaho at Army and Oregon State meets Arizona State in a night game at Tempe.

Italy Tops US In Cup Net Play

ROME (AP)—Italy defeated the United States in interzone Davis Cup play today and won the right to challenge Australia for the coveted tennis trophy.

Nicola Pietrangeli scored the decisive third point by defeating Jon Douglas of Santa Monica, Calif., 9-7, 6-3, 6-2.

Italy went into the final two single matches leading 2-1, and needing to win only one more point.

Douglas, sixty-ranked American tennis player, was no match for the big Italian. Only in the first set, which lasted 58 minutes, did he battle on even terms.

Douglas previously had won the single American victory by defeating Fausto Gardini 4-6, 4-6, 7-5, 10-8, 6-0.

The final singles match of the day, which pitted Whitney Reed of Alameda, Calif., against Gardini, was reduced to a formality.

Pietrangeli gave Italy two points by beating Reed in singles, 2-6, 6-8, 6-4, 6-4 and by carrying the brunt of the load as Italy won the doubles match yesterday.

The husky Pietrangeli teamed with Orlando Sirola to defeat Reed and Donald Dell of Bethesda, Md., 6-4, 3-6, 6-3, 6-2.

Last year Italy beat the United States in the interzone final. In the challenge round, Australia defeated Italy to retain the Davis Cup.

Tennis experts here think the Australians are likely to do the same again this year, whether the Italians or the Americans win the interzone final and go on to the challenge round.

College Football Steaming

 Don't go away...the fun's just started. A college football season already replete with its fair quota of excitement and surprises steams toward the midway point, picking up momentum like a sprung-loose fullback.

This Saturday's program, for example, offers a number of highlights. Notre Dame, returned to elite status in a hurry, takes on Michigan State in a meeting of all-winning team. Texas carries its perfect record into Arkansas, where the giant-killing razorbacks are waiting.

Mississippi's rebels rated first nationally, play Tulane. Third-ranked Alabama meets Tennessee in another Southeastern Conference feature, and Iowa-Wisconsin and Ohio State-Northwestern top the big ten card.

Michigan State and Notre Dame had impressive victories Saturday. The Spartans smothered Michigan 28-0 behind Pete Smith's smart quarterbacking. The Irish, eighth nationally, used 22 backs in rolling over and around Southern California 30-0.

Arkansas tripped ninth-ranked Baylor 23-13.

Texas' fourth-ranked Longhorns clouted Oklahoma for the fourth successive year, 28-7. Ole Miss, showing off its platoons of talent, crushed Houston 47-7. Pat Trammell guided "Bama" to its 26-7 victory over North Carolina.

Iowa, second in the nation although riddled by injuries, managed a 27-8 decision over Indiana. Ohio State overwhelmed Illinois 44-0.

In the upset category Saturday—Dick Heyd's margin of victory in its 10-6 conquest of Penn State. California topped Washington 21-14. Two third quarter touchdowns by Roger Holdinsky enabled West Virginia to overcome Pitt 20-6.

Duke, Florida and Nebraska all suffered their first setbacks of the season. A second half surge carried Georgia Tech over Duke, 21-0. Rice came from behind twice for a 19-10 victory over Florida. Syracuse beat Nebraska 28-6.

Dartmouth remained undefeated, swamping Brown 34-0. The Indians have registered 92 points to three for the opposition in three starts.

Teacher Outlasts Student

RIVERSIDE, Calif. (AP)—Tutor Jack Brabham gave young Bruce McLaren a driving lesson Sunday: How to pass and win on the next-to-last lap.

That's just what 35-year-old Brabham did to his Cooper-Monaco Climax teammate at the 53rd Southern California Grand Prix for sports cars before 70,000 fans. Brabham, an Australian who lives in England, has taught McLaren, 24, for six years.

The pair pushed their 2.7 liter cars head and head for the full 203 miles. For 27 laps it was a second place battle but then favorite Stirling Moss lost, seven laps to a brake fluid leak and the Brabham-McLaren battle was for first.

With two laps to go McLaren's light green speedster broke a radiator hose. On the ninth turn of the 61st lap, Brabham shot to the lead. McLaren ran into traffic trouble, lost ten lanes, and hit the finish a lap later, 11 seconds behind.

Indian Soph Top Lineman

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Stanford sophomore end Frank Patitucci today won Big Five Conference "lineman of the week" honors.

Patitucci, a 6-3 201-pounder of Montebello, Calif., was making his debut as a starter, substituting for the injured Steve Pursell.

He put on a dazzling defensive and offensive show in Stanford's 17-6 conquest of San Jose State. He intercepted two passes, recovered a fumble, made several key tackles and caught one 17-yard pass.

The Jets' D.J. Swartz was high scorer with 19 points. Los Angeles hit three out of nine from the three-point zone while the Saints made one out of five.

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
