

Salvation Army Local Program Gets UF Support

Editor's Note: This is another of a Herald and News series of articles relating to agencies of the Klamath County United Fund. As many of the 27 agencies will be covered in subsequent stories as time and space permit.

"Marching with trumpet and drum, with banners and bonnets they come..."

The Salvation Army marched into Klamath Falls on Sept. 7.

1921. In the intervening years these unarmed "warriors" have waged battle in behalf of the less fortunate in our community. While the Salvationists have warred against despair and discouragement, their program has always been marked by a positive approach to human problems.

Support for the Salvation Army's local program comes from your contribution to the Klamath County United Fund.

A slogan long identified with the Salvation Army is, "A man may be down, but he's never out." It came from the turbulent times of the Boer War in South Africa. Many people, left homeless and destitute at that time, were referred to as "down and outers."

A Salvation Army worker ended the connotation with that reply which has become a battle cry of the Salvationists since the turn of the century.

Time and time again, as a result of encouragement, interest and effort of the SA, those who were down have come up again. Motivation of the Salvation Army in Klamath Falls, as all over the world, is love for God and a concern for the needs of humanity.

This is expressed by service whose purpose is to bring dignity and meaning to life. It is also expressed by a wide variety of social services which are extended without discrimination.

To the man who is down; to the lonely widow looking for a long-lost son; to the alcoholic seeking another chance; to the man on parole; to the spiritually troubled; to the anxious young woman, unmarried, but expecting a child, the sign of The Salvation Army in this community is an important avenue of help.

A member agency of Klamath County United Fund, the Salvation Army provides many local services. Behind The Salvation Army's Red Shield of service are many state and regional services, which are also available to people of this area through the local Salvation Army.

Among these are the Men's Social Service Centers, where unattached and homeless men have an opportunity to reclaim their lives and regain a place in society; homes for unwed mothers, where

shelter, the finest of medical care and expert counseling are available; and Harbor Light centers where alcoholics can "dry out" and get help for their problem.

When a local resident seeks the help of the local Salvation Army officer in locating a missing relative or friend, the officer can call on the resources of The Salvation Army Missing Persons Bureau to help him. An international organization active in 86 countries and colonies, The Salvation Army is especially well equipped to offer help in the location of loved ones.

Young women from this community going to large metropolitan centers to find jobs, to further their studies in art or music, or to embark upon careers, find comfortable home-like accommodations in the Evangeline residences, which are women's clubs the Salvation Army maintains in big cities across the country.

The Salvation Army often serves as an important liaison between an imprisoned man and his family, living in a distant community.

Three Held For Illegal Deer Meat

A midnight chase late Sunday on the Swan Lake Road about 10 miles north of Highway 66 led to the arrest of three Klamath Falls youths on charges of illegal possession of deer.

State police said a Swan Lake area landowner called and said a pickup truck was spotlighting deer. The landowner gave chase and the pickup truck overturned on a curve.

Douglas S. McCracken, 21, 2571 Lakeshore Drive, identified as driver of the pickup, was thrown out of the vehicle. He and two passengers, Robert T. Schroeder, 21, 3513 Quarry Street, and Steve L. Bonawitz, 19, 3511 Quarry Street, were charged with illegal possession of deer when police found three untagged deer in the back of their pickup.

Schroeder and Bonawitz pleaded guilty Monday afternoon in district court. Judge Hal F. Coe sentenced both to pay \$250 fines but suspended \$150 of the fines. The youths were given the option of paying the \$100 balance or spending 20 days in jail. Bonawitz asked if he could have credit.

"There is no credit in this court," Judge Coe replied. "I have very little sympathy for people who shoot deer without tags." Schroeder answered "yes" when Judge Coe asked him if he was "just out having a good time shooting deer."

McCracken suffered cuts and bruises in the crash and was taken to Klamath Valley Hospital, where his condition was reported as "good" Monday afternoon. He will appear later in court.

YMCA Sponsors Two New Programs

The YMCA Boys Rifle Club will offer instruction in conjunction with the Oregon Hunter Safety

Program which will qualify young hunters under the new law.

Legislation enacted this past session makes it mandatory for hunters under 18 years of age to have Oregon Hunter Safety Program certification before they are licensed.

Instruction will be under the supervision of Earl Sweet, head of the Oregon Technical Institute Gunsmithing Department. The hunter safety program will be administered in five week sessions, 10 students per session. Cost is \$2 for the entire course, which includes rifles, ammunition, instruction fee and a completion

Air Force Band To Play KU Concert Wednesday

A musical organization that outdrew Adolf Hitler in the stadium which he built will arrive for a concert in Klamath Falls tomorrow.

The United States Air Force Band is slated for a concert in Pelican Court, Klamath Union High School, Wednesday at 8 p.m. In 1961 the USAF band appeared in Berlin's Olympic Stadium, filling the 105,000 seat amphitheater. Hitler, in the years from 1936-1945, failed to ever completely fill the huge stadium.

The band appears here under the auspices of the Klamath Union High School Music Department. Proceeds from the concert will go into the working fund. Tickets are available from KUHS music students, Bowden's Music Store and Derby's Music Store. Reserved seats will be \$1.50 and regular admission, \$1 for the performance. An earlier show will be held for students Wednesday afternoon.

The Air Force Band set a world record for attendance at Manila while on a tour of the Pacific. They drew 200,000 people to Manila City's Lunetta Park.
