Miss AMERICA BOWLS

Explosion Point

The last step in the four-step approach is vital.



AT THE END of the step comes the explosion point.

The two preceding steps are, in a sense, automatic. Here's what happens on the fourth step if everything is working:

The left foot and right arm are synchronized. As the right arm descends in the pendulum, downward and forward, the left foot begins to slide. The ball should be neither behind nor ahead of the bowler.

At the end of the step comes the explosion point. This is the instant when the ball leaves the hand and the follow through begins. Much happens quickly. And it is all so important that many instructors begin their teaching of a student, who is not a beginner, by observing what he does here.

Billy Welu, a first team bowling All-American, gave me some fourth-step hints. The left foot should never leave the lane. The feet should be at right angles to the foul line. The shoulders should be parallel to the foul line, except when angling for a spare shot.

The bowler should be steady and well balanced.

Don't Look, But ... Odds Favor UW '11, UCLA, Mich. State

NEW YORK (UPI) — Second-ranked Michigan State is a 7-point favorite to down fifth-ranked Notre Dame in their "meeting of the unbeaten" Saturday.

Both teams scored impressive victories last Saturday, the Spartans downing previously unbeaten Michigan, 28-0, for their fourth straight triumph of the season and Notre Dame clobbering Southern California, 30-0, to run its record to 4-0.

Mississippi, the nation's No. 1 college football team, is a whopping 28-point choice over Tulane, but third-ranked Texas is only a 4-point favorite over Arkansas.

In the three regionally televised games Saturday, Penn State is a narrow 1-point choice over Syracuse, Alabama is a 6-point favorite over Tennessee, and California is a similar one-touchdown favorite over Southern California.

Navy is picked to defeat Detroit by at least 7 points in a Friday night game.
