New Winter Sport Area Planned At Mt. Ashland

A new major winter sports area is being planned for the Pacific Northwest. The forest service has called for applications and bids for the development and operation of a commercial winter sports enterprise at Mt. Ashland, according to C. E. Brown, forest supervisor, Rogue River National Forest. Mt. Ashland is in the Siskiyou Mountains, eight miles south of Ashland.

Bids will be opened July 2, 1962, according to Brown. Plans for the development of the Mt. Ashland site call for construction of a lodge, ski shop, food and beverage facilities, and utilities, as well as ski lifts and tows. A term permit will be issued to the successful bidder for a period of 20 years, with provision for renewal, for the area upon which buildings, ski lifts, and other structures are to be built. An annual permit will be issued for a larger area to include the ski slopes and runs not covered in the term permit.

A bid form and prospectus has been distributed to each known interested bidder. Further information can be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Rogue River National Forest, P.O. Box 512, Medford, Ore.

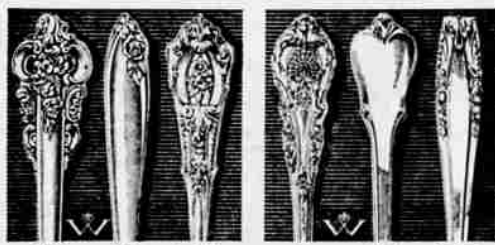

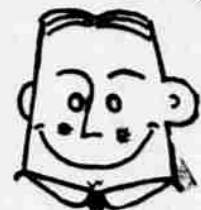

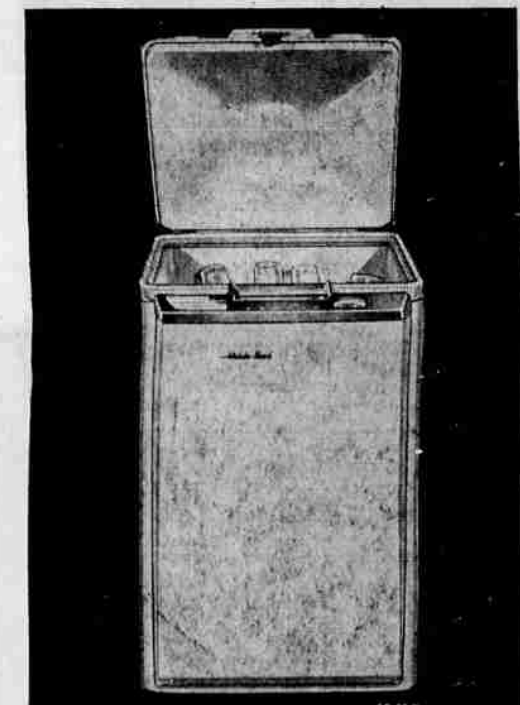
