Local YMCA Supported By United Fund Drive

This is another of a Herald News series of reports on the 27 United Fund agencies. As many stories dealing with the remaining agencies will be published as time and space permit.

Many people are unaware of what the YMCA really is and what it means. The letters YMCA are an abbreviation of the words Young Men's Christian Association. The emblem of the "Y," the red triangle represents the entire personality — mind, spirit, and body. The YMCA's purpose is to develop a Christian personality and build a Christian society, working not only with men and boys but with women and girls—the entire family group.

In helping develop the human personality, the YMCA's program runs into many different areas. For youth we have swimming, camping, gym classes, club groups. For adults, men's and women's physical exercise classes, facilities for individual exercise, such as a handball court, weights, steam room, etc., and square dancing classes which will begin on Oct. 19. For the family we have the Family Night potluck dinners on the second and fourth Fridays of each month with games and movies to round out the evening, plus the Friday Night family swim which will begin on Nov. 10.

Other available activities are boys rifle classes, swimming — with instruction — for men, women, girls and boys as well as a class for the physically handicapped each Monday night. Boys gym classes will include instruction on the trampoline and in tumbling.

The Tri-Hi-Y and Hi-Y clubs for high school boys and girls are now meeting regularly. Because of limited space, dates and time for most of these activities have been left out but anyone interested in the schedule of events may call the YMCA, TU 4-4149 for this information.

There are many other activities in the planning stages which will be starting soon. The local YMCA is a participating agency of the United Fund and as such everyone is asked to stop in and find out more about "Y" role in the community.

The Modoc Toastmasters Club will celebrate the 37th anniversary of Toastmasters International by conducting an Alumni Meeting next Tuesday morning at 6:30 at the Willard Hotel. Special recognition will be given to former members who are urged to attend. The breakfast meeting is open to anyone interested in speech training.

In charge of the meeting will be Joseph Mercer, toastmaster; Bob Knuths, topicmaster; and Dr. Glenn Miller, general critic. Speakers for the occasion will be Adolph Fuller, Charles Glidden, and Herman Smith.

Started by Ralph C. Smedley at Santa Ana, Calif., on Oct. 22, 1924, the world-wide speech organization has trained more than half a million men in the art of self-expression. Smedley founded Toastmasters on the premise that you learn by doing. This theory has proved highly successful. Public speaking, says a 63-year-old founder, is actually only "amplified conversation." Toastmasters is not a school for orators. It is a self-help organization which teaches men to listen analytically, to think constructively, and to speak effectively and concisely.
