

'Hardboiled, Softboiled' Terms Tickle Europeans

WASHINGTON (UPI)—American and Allied diplomats here are fascinated by the way that Washington's favorite game, "hardboiled or softboiled," is apparently catching on in Europe.

Hardboiled and softboiled are terms used here to classify President Kennedy's principal aides. The word hardboiled describes a man who is for toughness and toughness in dealings with the Soviets. Softboiled means the opposite.

Now, the fascinating thing about the game is that people who are regarded as notoriously hardboiled here are sometimes pictured as softboiled on the other side of the Atlantic.

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'Vopos' Would Flee, Say Defectors

BERLIN (AP)—Two East German policemen who fled to the West say half of the police in the Communist zone would join them if they could.

Horst Staebert, 19, and Bernhard Heinecke, 21, made the statement to newsmen Friday in telling of their escapes earlier this week from the Red barricade dividing Berlin.

"How many Vopos (Communist People's Police) would desert if they got the chance," a newsmen asked the two in an interview at a West Berlin refugee camp.

"At least 50 per cent," said Horst. Then he asked Bernhard, "Wouldn't you say about that?"

"Easily," the other replied.

The two met for the first time at the camp after scaling the barbed wire and brick barrier in separate flights from their patrol posts along the border.

On duty at the wall, they had blended in with other Vopos standing guard—submachine guns

cradled in their arms—against escape attempts by East Germans.

They wore their Russian-style green uniforms open at the throat their hair long and unkempt and chain smoked while staring at the West Berliners gathered on the other side.

Like most of the hundreds of Vopos strung out around West Berlin, they had been brought into the East from camps in the provinces late in July, shortly before the Communist regime clamped a lid on the border.

Horst, wiry, blond and freckled, had joined up for a three-year stretch in 1959 because he got fed up with his tame life in his home town.

Bernhardt, open-faced and snub-nosed, had a job at a refinery, but signed up last year because of pressure from Communist zealots to serve East Germany.

The youths learned to handle weapons — carbines, grenades, submachine guns, light and heavy machine guns, mortars—and got used to barracks life and discipline.

They didn't find it so bad.

The food — one heavy meal at noon, bread and spread in the mornings and evenings — was about the same as they'd gotten in their simple homes. Horst's father is a railroad worker in Saxony and Bernhardt's a brick-

Kennedy Coast Visit Planned

NEWPORT, R.I. (AP)—President Kennedy will witness Navy and Marine Corps maneuvers at San Diego, Calif., Nov. 18, the White House announced today.

Assistant Press Secretary Andrew T. Hatcher said the maneuvers will include amphibious landing operations and carrier-based air strikes.

Hatcher said the aircraft carrier Kitty Hawk and naval and marine units in the San Diego area are expected to take part in the exercises.

Kennedy will fly to San Diego from Phoenix, Ariz., on Nov. 17 and spend the night at the North Island Naval Air Station, Hatcher said.

Hatcher said Kennedy may include Los Angeles as a stop on his western trip, but that no final decision had been made.

Nikita's Propaganda Sparks Purge Of Enemies

BERLIN (AP)—Nikita Khrushchev's heavy propaganda artillery is zeroing in on his enemies. The events at the Soviet Communist party congress in Moscow suggest he is winning his struggle and setting the scene for announcement of a house-cleaning.

It seems likely, in fact, that the purge already is well under way. Probably it was started well in advance of the 22nd party congress, at least at the lower levels.

But Khrushchev wants and apparently needs total victory. This means at a minimum the expulsion from the Communist party of those he labeled antiparty in 1957.

The congress can provide the machinery for Khrushchev's purposes.

Awaiting formal approval are some new ideas concerning the

statutes by which the Communist party is supposed to govern itself. The changes may involve new methods for expelling and punishing members who have fallen into disgrace. There are indications that new sins will be invented, such as failure to show sufficient devotion to the Communist cause or lack of faithfulness to the principle of collective leadership.

If Khrushchev has won, heads will roll. It will mean expulsion from the party and possibly worse for former Premier Georgi Malenkov, for Lazar Kaganovich, the one-time iron commissar of the Ukraine and a Stalin stalwart, for old former Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov, for former Premier Nikolai Bulganin and many others.

Insurance Car-Bombing Try Charged Divorcee

SCRANTON, Pa. (UPI)—The 30-year-old son of a meat packer and his attractive divorcee girl friend were charged Friday night with a nearly successful attempt to car-bomb her former husband to death for \$34,000 in life insurance.

Robert C. Kaufman, a husky former salesman for Eastern Provision Co., his father's meat packing firm, and Mrs. Sarah Molter, 32, were freed in \$5,000 bail on charges of conspiracy and the illegal use of explosives.

State police said the couple tried to kill Floyd Molter, 33, of Jutland, N.J., May 12 with a dynamite charge set off under the floor boards of his car with an automatic timing device.

Molter was severely injured when the explosion went off outside a roadside near here where he had just been drinking with his former wife.

Investigators said the brown-haired Mrs. Molter carried \$34,000 in life insurance on her former husband. Police said Molter knew she had insurance on his life but he thought it amounted to about \$20,000.

Kaufman, father of four, and Mrs. Molter, who had one child, admitted they were "romantically involved" before and after the dynamiting, the district attorney's office said. But they denied knowing anything about the explosion.

The couple told the district attorney's office that their romance was over now.

Police said they learned that Kaufman had purchased dynamite from a friend shortly before Molter's car was rigged.

Molter received extensive leg injuries in the blast and was in critical condition for several weeks in Hahnemann Hospital here. His injuries required repeated surgery but he has been able to work recently.

Mrs. Molter, who lives in Madisonville, Pa., works in a beauty shop.

Paar Said 'Sensitive'

CHICAGO (AP)—Robert W. Sarnoff, board chairman of the National Broadcasting Co., says Jack Paar is a "very sensitive man" who "takes a little personally" things that are said about him in the press.

But Sarnoff added, "I neither endorse nor disclaim" the position the NBC television entertainer took recently in accusing certain newspapers and wire services of distortions and inaccuracies.

Paar made the public charges in answering criticism of a TV show he filmed on the border between East and West Germany.

Sarnoff's reaction to Paar's remarks, the first from an NBC official, was given in a question and answer session at a meeting of the Executives' Club of Chicago and later at a news conference Friday.

Fire Damages Three Planes

WINSLOW (AP)—Fire badly damaged three small private planes at the Bainbridge Island Airport Saturday.

The planes were tied down in the open. The fire was reported about 3 a.m.

Deputy Sheriff Ken Chaussee of Winslow was checking a report the fires may have been arson.

Fisher Picked By Doctors

PORTLAND (AP)—Dr. G. Alan Fisher was installed as president of the Oregon Academy of General Practice Friday at a luncheon meeting in conjunction with the group's 14th annual convention.

Fisher is a Gresham general practitioner.

Dr. Ernest P. Greenwood, Salem, was named president-elect. Dr. Vernon D. Casterline, Salem, was chosen vice-president; and Dr. Richard J. O'Shea, Oswego, was reelected treasurer.

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
