

Youths Cited In Accidents

Two young Klamath Falls men were cited by city police Sunday after they were involved in traffic accidents.

William P. Albers, 18, 3952 Clinton Street, was cited for violating the basic rule while Paul L. Pickering, about 23, Kingsley Field, was cited for following too closely.

Albers' car ran into a parked car at 3 a.m. Sunday in front of 1414 East Main Street. A second parked car was also damaged. Police said Albers was driving too close to the parked cars, which were owned by Douglas R. Baker, 1414 East Main Street. Damage was extensive to Albers' car.

Pickering was cited after his car collided with one driven by Don L. Evans, 21, 927 Eldorado Street, Sunday night at the corner of Seventh and Main streets. Police said Evans' car was stopped when it was struck from the rear by Pickering's car. Pickering's car had extensive front end damage. Neither driver was injured.

A hit-run accident was also under investigation by city police. Mike Eich, 1023 Alandale Street, said his car was parked in front of his house early Sunday morning, when it was struck in the left rear fender by a black Chevrolet Impala, which left the scene.

Two Report Tires Cut

Two men reported to police Sunday morning that tires on their cars had been slashed during the night.

E. Gail Osborn, 350 Martin Street, and Jack A. Corra, 420 Division Street, each reported that four of their tires had been slashed. Osborn's car was parked in front of his house and Corra's pickup truck was in front of his house.

Arrested and charged with disorderly conduct (vandalism) was Paul L. Bellm Jr., 19, 3806 Clinton Street. He was identified by the woman as one of the trio she had seen. Bellm pleaded not guilty Monday morning and a hearing was set for a later date.

The other two youths, both 17, were lodged in the juvenile home for further disposition by the county juvenile department. Police said both had been drinking.
